

GETS MORE THAN SHE DEMANDED

Mrs. Hattie Deloro Barnes Given Verdict Against Shropshire.

HUSBAND PROMINENT MAN

PLAINTIFF WAS WIFE OF W. S. BARNES OF SAN FRANCISCO.

FEMININITY carried the day with a sweeping victory yesterday in the suit of Mrs. Hattie Deloro Barnes against Clyde Shropshire for money alleged to have been loaned.

In the trial of the breach of promise suit which followed, it developed that Mrs. Barnes is no other than the divorced wife of William S. Barnes, a prominent lawyer of San Francisco, and son of General W. H. L. Barnes, one of the most prominent men in the state and several times candidate for United States senator.

The finding of the jury on the four counts in the complaint is as follows: First cause of action, \$21,200; second cause of action, \$10,774; third cause of action, \$10,822; fourth cause of action, \$1,893.94; total, \$44,690.94.

The last day developed into a battle between the attorneys for the contesting parties. Judge Henry Rives scathingly denounced Mrs. Barnes as an adventuress and a designing woman, while Attorney E. B. Critchlow was no less merciful on Mr. Shropshire.

He thundered the attorney, "but before the trial closes he will go out of this courtroom a discredited, dishonored thing."

The attorney claimed that the members of the bar could not be thankful enough for Mrs. Barnes, who, in exposing men like Shropshire, put every lawyer coming into contact with the defendant on his guard.

Mr. Critchlow concluded his address by referring to how the show stranded in Georgia and how Shropshire went home, while Mrs. Barnes secured an engagement with the "Stranger in New York" company, and how, after waiting months for Shropshire to keep his promise and marry her, she finally found that he had in the meantime married another woman.

Mrs. Barnes Tells Her Story. Mrs. Barnes, who was the first witness, began her testimony by saying she was 35 years of age, and was the divorced wife of William S. Barnes of San Francisco.

More and more friendly did the couple become till Christmas, '95. "I was having link cuff buttons made," said the witness, "when Mr. Shropshire promised me a ring for Christmas. It was to have five diamonds, and when the holiday season arrived Mr. Shropshire told me he had had trouble in matching the stones, so I didn't get the ring till New Year's day."

"What did he say to you?" asked Mr. Critchlow. The witness seemed slightly confused.

Called It Engagement Ring. "He put the ring on my finger and told me to consider it my engagement ring," she replied.

"What were your relations at the time?" asked the attorney. "We were very friendly," was the answer. "Several days before Christmas he took me to the hotelkeeper and introduced me as his fiancée—the future Mrs. Shropshire."

Mr. Critchlow then drew from the witness statements that before this Shropshire borrowed small sums of money, which constantly increased. This was followed by the witness with the statement that nearly every one in Paris saw them together and thought them engaged.

Shortly after Christmas Mrs. Barnes' contracts ran out and she was making arrangements to travel in Austria, when, in a desire to keep her in Paris, Mr. Shropshire, she said, sent her to Manager Marchon of a vaudeville theatre and instructed him to engage her at a greatly reduced salary, he agreeing to make up the deficiency.

At this juncture 5 o'clock was reached and court adjourned till this morning at 10 o'clock, when Mrs. Barnes will continue her testimony.

SIX POLICEMEN FOR FOUR PLACES

Chief Paul's Appointments to Vacancies Returned to Him.

CITY TANKMEN CENSURED

PUMPING SCHEME CARRIES AND GARBAGE PROBLEM UP.

IN line with his expressed intention, Chief of Police Paul endeavored at last night's city council meeting to have filled the four vacancies existing in the police department, but in the effort he sought, doubtless unwittingly, to fill two more places than are vacant.

The complication which seemed imminent was avoided by sending the appointments back to the chief, in order to give him opportunity to designate the police officers to fill the vacancies of three patrolmen and a detective pending the enactment of an ordinance increasing the membership of the police department.

The appointments submitted by Chief Paul included the names of A. A. Alkire, R. Shannon, George P. Watson, Henry Jones, C. M. Evans and P. J. McDermott. Of these, the latter four were appointed by Chief Hilton, but their confirmation was withheld on the knowledge that Mayor Thompson would refuse to concur in any appointments made by the former chief.

In the discussion over the motion to return the appointments to Chief Paul, Robertson remarked that an ordinance ought to be passed, increasing the police force six men, as the chief desired. He believed the chief understood the situation, and he surmised that all would be well if enough names were submitted to fill the four vacancies.

Chairman Eardley suggested that while there are four vacancies, the two prison guards are doing patrol duty and they should be returned so that the city prisoners may be worked on the rock pile. He added that there are now only thirty policemen available.

The contract was approved by a vote of eight to two. Daveler and Robertson voting in the negative.

Bids For City Land Rejected. Two sealed bids were received for the purchase of the city's 129 1/2 x 153 feet of ground on the police station corner. W. F. Colton proposed to give \$37,500, and John Weir, Jr., offered \$41,115, provided he shall have the use of the alley on the south.

Councilman Robertson declared that the land is worth at least \$45,000, to say nothing of the \$10,000 excavation already made, and on his motion the bids were rejected. It was also decided that no further effort will be made for a time yet to sell the property.

Eardley offered a resolution directing the health department to return to the practice of hauling away at public expense all ashes and tin cans from the front of residences, provided such garbage be placed in proper receptacles at the curb. The resolution provided for the employment of another team to do the work.

Action on the resolution was deferred for one week on Robertson's request, claiming that one extra wagon cannot do the work satisfactorily. In the same connection the home and education section of the Ladies' Literary club requested the council to adopt a systematic method of removing and disposing of unsanitary garbage, but action on the petition was also deferred.

Mayor Thompson's appointment of A. H. Little as night foreman of street sprinkling was confirmed without dissent.

NOT A POUND OF COAL IS MINED

Tie Up Is Complete in the Anthracite District.

HANNA HAS GIVEN UP HOPE

DESPAIRS OF RECONCILING THE DISPUTANTS.

HAZLETON, PA., May 14.—The convention of the anthracite mine workers held two sessions in the opera house here today, and without taking any action on the question of a permanent strike, adjourned until tomorrow morning. About 700 delegates are in attendance. The convention is meeting behind closed doors, and although nothing officially is given out, it is known that the all-important question was not reached, the two sessions being devoted entirely to the organization of the meeting and the report of the committee on credentials. President Mitchell was chairman of the convention.

The day brought forth no definite information bearing on the probable action of the convention, and the situation tonight remains about the same as it has been during the past forty-eight hours.

President Mitchell said that all hope of any concessions from the operators was gone. He has had no recent communication, he said, with the mine owners, Senator Hanna or any other member of the National Civic Federation. He admitted that he had some advice to give to the delegates at the proper time, but what it is he would not say. In an interview today he said that there was no doubt that the sentiment of the men is in favor of a strike, but he refused to make any reply when asked if he would give advice that would come in conflict with their sentiments.

It is admitted that what President Mitchell suggests will be done, notwithstanding the fact that a majority of the delegates are in favor of a strike if the mine owners do not make concessions. Therefore, it looks very much as though the whole matter rests with
