GIANT CATTLE ON THE GROUND

BUILDINGS SUBSTANTIAL - AN IMPOSING MAIN ENTRANCE.

In a brilliant and bewildering heap on the floor of the main building on the fair grounds yesterday were piled the materials which the workmen expect to use for decorations.

Everything about the place looks new. On a distant part of the grounds were the stock sheds built in the shape of an F. The buildings haven't had a chance to get weather-beaten.

Getting Things Ready. Most imposing of all is the main building, which looks like pictures of Italian architecture.

Some of the cattle are already on the ground and men were busy grooming them yesterday. Some of the breeds were gigantic and the animals which had been spruced up were carefully covered with canvas blankets.

Display of Sheep. The sheep were enclosed in lattice-work pens. Some of them seemed very neighborly, but others were more exclusive and drew away when they saw a stranger.

Some of the exhibits are already in the building. One has as display of strained honey. There seems to be honey enough in the exhibit to sweeten all the four tappers in Salt Lake City.

Arbor of Wheat. Next to it is an arbor of wheat with a green background. The arbor is thirty staked with electric lights and it will be a dream in emerald and gold.

On the floor near one of the unlabelled booths was a corner of Oriental lanterns and Japanese fans and parasols. A stuffed buffalo peeped around the corner and one of the lanterns was decorated with a ham sandwich that one of the workmen had put there and forgotten.

There was enough done yesterday to give an idea of the general effect, and this will be beautiful. The attractiveness of the display will be enhanced at night and all the decorations are being made with the double purpose of having them show off to the best advantage when the full glare of light is turned upon the scene.
