Some day when you are in a hurry or short of money you can crop into the Portland House on First South street just around the corner. They don't give you a napkin there, but you can't

get a cup of fine coffee, better coffee, in fact, than some of the high-priced places are serving, and two rolls, doughnuts or some cake for a nickel. If you want to be reckless and spend another nickel you can get a piece of pie, a large ham sandwich.

Of course if you want to be extravagant and throw money away there are several restaurants farther down the street where they charge you 15 cents for a square meal; dinner now ready when 10 cents will get you as far as the other day a man went into one of the 10-cent restaurants. Enough for four more meals? Not when liquor is so cheap. That man walked four Salt Lake blocks and passed half a dozen higher priced restaurants to get a square meal for 10 cents, because he can get four drinks for the other 40 cents. That man doesn't propose to waste money on expensive food when he can get a full stomach and a "jag" for the price that they would probably cost a banquet at one of the Main street restaurants.

Of course, there are innumerable bakeries where a quick lunch of coffee, bakedstuffs and eggs in any style can be had for 10 or 15 cents, but these places are patronized mostly by clerks and business men who are in too much of a hurry to go home and who want something they can bolt down while the man at the office or the store, somewhere, is waiting. There are places on Second South street where people are fairly prodigal. Here 20 cents is often spent on one meal, and in some instances as high as 25 cents is thrown away for a dinner.


