

KILLS BILL FOR UTAH CONTROL

Senate Opposes Regulating Foreign Corporations. PRESENT LAW IS EVADED BUT SOLONS LEAVE IT ON STATUTE BOOKS.

State control of foreign corporations owning Utah corporations was made impossible by the state senate yesterday. The upper house buried Senator George N. Lawrence's bill having that in view by a vote of 10 to 6.

Cites Trip to California. BARBERS' BILL PASSES HOUSE

The Haslam barber bill went through the house yesterday with little opposition. One amendment was attached, making the provisions apply only to cities of the first and second classes.


