

TANNER DENIES THE ACCUSATION

Stake Presidency Says He is Not a Polygamist.

NO CHARGES ARE ON RECORD

RUSSELL REFUSES TO DISCUSS THE MATTER.

Judge H. S. Tanner of the city court made a most emphatic denial yesterday of the charge that he was a polygamist.

The first presidency of the Mormon church and the first presidency of the stake of Zion held a joint session yesterday and investigated the matter.

Judge Makes a Flat Denial.

The records of the church in this city, it was stated further, and those in other cities in Utah where such are kept on file, do not show that the judge has two or more wives.

"I have not so much to say about the matter," said Judge Tanner when he was asked yesterday afternoon, "There is absolutely nothing in the story."

County Attorney Wants Evidence.

"You may state for me that Samuel Russell, who I understand, has taken a great interest in the matter, is not a member of the stake to which I belong and had no ecclesiastical right to vote in the meeting which he attended."

"There is nothing I can do," he continued, "if Mr. Russell will inform me his evidence I will act in accordance with its strength. He has not called upon me yet."

Russell Avoids Pointed Questions.

Mr. Russell was found at his home last evening. He was asked questions confined to his room. He refused to say what occurred at the conference with Angus M. Cannon and was not disposed to discuss the subject.

Complete Denial by Taylor.

Joseph E. Taylor, a member of the first presidency of the stake of Zion, said when seen yesterday, "There is not a particle of truth in the statement. There have been no charges made to the stake presidency to that effect by Mr. Russell, and there are none to be made."
