SHORT TALK AT HARRISBURG

AN IMMENSE CONCOURSE OF PEOPLE IN WAITING.

Washington, April 1.—President Roosevelt at 9:05 this morning started on his western trip under the most favorable auspices. As the special train pulled out of the Pennsylvania station the president stood on the platform of his car, tipping his hat and smiling in response to the enthusiastic cheers of hundreds of admirers.

As early as 8 o'clock a crowd began to gather at the White House to witness the president's departure. As he entered his carriage to drive to the station the men made the historic gesture of waving their handkerchiefs and many of them their hats.

The Pennsylvania station and platform were crowded with people anxious to extend to the president their good wishes for the successful journey. Notable precautions were taken to insure the safety of the president. The police arrangements were under the personal supervision of Commissioner West and Chief Sylvester.

As President Roosevelt alighted from his carriage he was joined by Secretary Hitchcock and they walked down the platform arm in arm, the president's right hand resting on his friend's shoulder. He was wearing a black cutaway coat, dark striped trousers and wore a black felt hat.

STOP AT HARRISBURG. Great Crowd Assembled to Welcome the President.

Harrisburg, Pa., April 1.—President Roosevelt's train arrived at 1:10 p. m. and remained here for ten minutes. The run from Washington to Harrisburg was uneventful, the president spending most of his time in reading.

The president was greeted in this city by a great crowd, including the members of the Pennsylvania legislature and city officials. Senator Focht, on behalf of the senate, presented greetings to the president. Senator Focht expressed regret that they were unable to welcome him at the capital, but were glad to welcome him in the shadow of Zion Lutheran church where the first Harrison was nominated for the presidency.
