

MEMORIAL DAY AT ARLINGTON

Thousands Visited the Graves of the Nation's Dead. ALL BUSINESS SUSPENDED IMPRESSIVE ORATION BY CHAS. EMORY SMITH.

Washington, May 30.—With solemn and impressive ceremonies Memorial day was observed in the national capital on a more elaborate scale than ever before. Business was suspended not only in the departments of the government, but throughout the city.

After a short march through the city the organizations in the parade boarded the electric trains for Arlington, where the principal exercises were held. The procession formed at the gates and a national salute was fired by the Fourth battery, United States field artillery, as it entered the grounds.

Charles Emory Smith, editor of the Philadelphia Press, delivered the oration of the day. He spoke in part as follows: "The beauty and sanctity of Memorial day, instead of declining, rather increases with the passing years."

IOWA'S CAPITAL SINKS UNDER WATER

Six Thousand People Without Food or Shelter. LONG NIGHT OF SUFFERING IMPOSSIBLE TO ESTIMATE THE DAMAGE.

Des Moines, Ia., May 30.—Four feet of water were coursing through a large section of East Des Moines' business district at daylight this morning, due to a rise of the river of one foot over its normal level.

Enormous Damage. The damage cannot be computed because of the fact that close to 2,000 buildings are submerged and it cannot be told whether they will be carried away. Great damage was done by the breaking of the levee along the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy track, which inundated the principal factory districts.

Trains Abandoned. Railway service is practically suspended. Water is over the Northwest, Washburn, Burlington and Rock Island tracks in many places in the city limits. From Fort Dodge, above here, the Des Moines river is reported to be two feet higher and still rising.

Des Moines, Ia., May 30.—At 10 o'clock Government Customs authorized the throwing open of the state capital to flood refugees. Cots were placed in the building and food provided.

BOWEN MAKES THEM SHIVER
