

NEVELL FAVORS LOCAL BRIEFS. UTAH LAKE SITE

Discusses Project With the Governor and Doremus.

DISPLEASED AT LOW WATER SURVEYS FOR RESERVOIR TO BE MADE AT ONCE.

F. H. Newell is quite favorably impressed with the proposition to make Utah lake a storage reservoir under the irrigation law passed by congress.

By special appointment Mr. Newell met with Governor H. M. Wells yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock, being accompanied by the executive chamberlain, State Engineer A. F. Doremus.

Mr. Newell prefaced his remarks by saying that he is ready and willing to cooperate with the Utah arid land reclamation commission.

The work of surveying the lake will be pushed with all possible haste. He has already begun by Professor Swenden of the Agricultural college at Logan.
