

NEW DEEP TUNNEL FOR PARK CITY Vindicator Mining Company Will Push Long Bore. TO GAIN DEPTH OF 2,000 FEET INTEREST IN MINING POSSIBILITIES ALONG NEW ROAD.

Consequent on the organization of the Vindicator Mining Company an important work is to be undertaken in the development of the southeastern part of the camp. This company, which has been organized with a capital of \$500,000, will undertake the development at depth by tunneling of twenty-six full claims. It is expected that the tunnel will drain all that portion of the camp.

The property of the new mining company is in the Snake creek district east of the St. Louis-Vassar and Wolverine and southeast of the Bonanza Consolidated and Park City Superior properties. The claims have been the property of W. H. Dodge and E. H. Airis, who are the principal organizers of the new company.

Work has been carried on at the property in a small way for the last two years, and it is now being convinced the owners that they are justified in resuming and pushing work on the main tunnel. This is already in 200 feet depth, and it is expected that the depth can be increased to 2,000 feet.

The recent encouraging developments at the St. Louis-Vassar and the Bonanza Consolidated and Park City Superior properties, the indications on the property encourage the organizers of the new company to believe they will open up a good mine in this section of the camp.

SHEBA WELL UNDER WAY. Description of New Fifty-ton Plant Now in Commission. In an extended description of the Sheba mine and mill, owned principally by Salt Lakers, the Lovelock Tribune says:

At present all the energies of the company are bent toward putting the Sheba in shape to produce. Sixteen men are at work on the property under superintendent Brooks. He took charge of the property a short time ago and is recommended as one of the best mining men in Utah. Mr. Kescei resigned to take a position near the mill in Utah.

"The mill was to start up this week. The bins were full of ore and the water was ready to turn on in the turbine wheel. Judge Barrett was to return home Thursday and hoped to see the mill running before he left. "Eight thousand dollars' worth of new machinery has been put in and the mill fixed up like new. Two Wilfley tables are in position and there is room for six more. The process is the crushing, jigging, Huntington mills and concentrating tables.

"Only water power is used at the mine and mill. The amount of power that can be developed is almost unlimited. There is about 100 feet of water in the creek coming down from Star peak, and it has a fall of about three thousand feet in four or five miles.

"The Sheba gives a new substance to mining nomenclature. It is graywhack. That 200-foot ledge between the porphyry and lime is filled with gaseous and the local miners call it graywhack. It partakes of the character of both lime and porphyry. It is believed that this will all give way to ore with depth."


