

THINKS DOVE IS BIRD OF EVIL

Spell of Gloom Cast Upon Murderers at Penitentiary.

HARBOR MESSENGER OF ILL DERGELIKE SONG IS FOLLOWED BY BAD TIDINGS.

Murderers Row at the state penitentiary has been cast into the depths of gloom. Superstition has thrown a black veil of uncertainty over the cells of the condemned.
