Manager Rader and Other Officials Step Down and Out.

CAUSES ARE NOT MENTIONED

COMPARISON ON PROFITS OF METAL MINING.

(Special to The Herald.) Kimberley, Oct. 11.—The Anne Laurie company's properties here are undergoing a radical change in their management, Captain Charles I. Rader, who has been the general manager of the company, steps out to occupy a position elsewhere, and Mr. Hyde, who has filled the position of company surveyor, the American Mining Association, and a general favorite among the employees of the company.

FOUNDING OUT METAL

Dalton Mill Making Rich Concentrates of Gold Vein Ore.

(Marvysvale Free Lance.) The Dalton mill is making rich concentrates of gold vein ore, more particularly Wedge ore, than any other mill in the district.

Some little trouble has been encountered in the crusher parts, an order being sent to Salt Lake for duplicate parts but when received, lasted but a short time.

The last lot of concentrates from the mill, Manager G. F. Dalton states, went ninety ounces in gold.

In the mine, in the vein in No. 2 tunnel, a depth of ninety feet from the surface a vein of ore five feet wide and which is increasing with depth, was encountered. An assay of the ore from the face of it gave assay returns of 39 to the ton.

In driving toward this vein the miners broke through the vein, and a considerable amount of water was run off. It means any possibility of having to close down the mine.

A Wilfley slime table has been installed at the King mill, and as soon as a few minor details are worked out, it will be in operation. It is the intention to put in a sand pump and work the tailings from the Wilfley table to the west of the mill.

White Knob Smelter. With 40,000 Tons of Ore in Bins, Plant Begins Operations.

(Wood River Times.) One of the White Knob Copper Company at Mackay went into commission last Monday and the other furnace is ready for work and will probably be put into commission this week.

The total capacity of the furnaces is 100 tons of ore a day of twenty-four hours. The economic reasons for the plant are that the ore is of a grade which can be operated at their full capacity or not at all.

Following the extraction of the ore from the bins the smelter will certainly make a campaign of forty days. In the meantime the extraction of the ore will continue, so that the furnaces may be kept in full blast for months and possibly for years.

Treasurer Van Duzer, accompanied by consulting engineer, was at Mackay consulting the blowing in of the furnace. He said that the furnace is a careful measurement and complete estimate demonstrated that there was a margin of safety of 200 per cent.

There were employed in the company's mines and forty additional in the offices and at the smelter.

MAGIC POWERS OF RADIUM

Peculiarities of Substance Found in Utah.

NEVADA'S MYSTERIOUS PEAK

METAL IS BASE OF UNIVERSE, SAYS PROF. LARKIN.

Since the announcement that the rare metal, radium, existed in the uranium ores of Grand county, and that Stephen A. Lockwood had formed a company to mine the ore and extract the precious substance from it, many of the principal papers of the country have had more or less to say on the subject.

Western papers are also alive to the importance of the discoveries which have been made, and it will not be many months before the mining industry after mining district will be advising the world that it contains the basic ores from which the remarkable substance can be extracted.

Prospector J. E. Davis Peak. "In this connection Nevada's highest mountain, known locally as Jeff Davis Peak, is again destined to play an important part in the shadow of this mountain, which lifts its head nearly 14,000 feet above the level of the sea, nestles the mining camp of Osceola, which has produced \$1,000,000 or more in placer gold by its mines.

Jeff Davis Peak itself is a mysterious mountain. In its bowels is Lehman's cave, which rivals Kentucky's natural wonder, both in extent and in the amount of water which while on its summit one becomes impressed with the idea that the huge mass is imbued with life and is in constant motion.

Prospectors who have spent brief periods on the peak were always ready to seek new fields after witnessing one storm on this grand old mountain, and they describe the scenes on those days as being as fearful as the scenes in their grandeur. The freaks played there by electric disturbances are well calculated to bring terror to the stoutest hearts.

Now, there is nothing remarkable in the fact that boulders roll down a mountain side, but in this instance the conditions are so remarkable that they would seem to call for careful investigation. The action of radium on other minerals, it has been claimed, will produce gold; uranium is known to be there in large quantities, and with the associate metals, tungsten, molybdenite, wolfram, scheelite, etc., and it is not impossible that nature's powder magazine, wherein is stored the material which may one day cause the destruction of the world, is located here in White Pine county.

Radium Is Base of the Universe. Professor Edgar Larkin, the eminent scientist who is in charge of the observatory, California, lectured in Los Angeles last Monday night on "Radioactivity," illustrating his lecture with all kinds of electric appliances. Finally he reached the subject of the new substance, according to the account in the Los Angeles Herald, said: "Now we come to the subject of the most mysterious of all the ages. Radium will emit these costly rays without losing a fraction of its weight, and it is the only substance which has added weight to the world, is not asking for sympathy.
