TIME TABLE IS TO BE CHANGED

Harriman Officials Meet in City For That Purpose.

NOTHING DECISIVE DONE

ANOTHER SESSION WILL BE HELD TODAY.

A meeting of the officials of the traffic, operating and motive power departments of the Harriman system was held yesterday morning at the office of Vice President and General Manager W. H. Bancroft of the Oregon Short Line.

The purpose of the meeting was to revise the time cards of the system with a view to lessening expenses in the operating department. The new schedule was not completed last night, but one change, it is understood, will be made in the Bluffe train, which now leaves Salt Lake at 12:30 a. m. It will leave at an earlier hour when the new time card is installed. Nos. 1 and No. 2, on the Union Pacific, known as the "Overland Limited," will run at the same time.

The meeting, which was executive, was called to order at 9 o'clock and lasted until 12:30 o'clock when those present adjourned to luncheon at the Alta club. In the afternoon the session lasted until a late hour, when adjournment was taken until this morning.

It is believed that some action is to be taken upon a proposed agreement between the Santa Fe and the Southern Pacific for the operation of the Utah coast line to western points. The meeting is one of the largest of its kind ever held in this city.
