COLORADO COAL FIELDS.

John Mitchell Endeavoring to Secure a Conference.

Trinidad, Colo., Dec. 3.—President John Mitchell of the United Mine Workers of America and the national officers and officials of district No. 15 resumed this morning the conference in regard to the strike situation which began last evening. It is reported that it has been decided to insist that the miners shall be permitted to select pit bosses and camp physicians. If the operators refuse to agree to this, or in the event that a conference is granted and no agreement is reached, it is understood that the United Mine Workers' officials to tie up all Colorado mining fields in a sympathetic strike. If possible, it was reported that Mitchell was today served with a summons to court in the suit of the Victor Fuel company for an injunction to restrain the United Mine Workers' officers from interfering in any manner with the operation of the company's mines.

WILL REJECT PROPOSITION.

Fuel Companies Have Made Up Their Minds.

Denver, Dec. 3.—Delos A. Chappell, president of the Victor Fuel company, said today that he would not accept any proposition that may be received from the United Mine Workers looking to the settlement of the strike in southern Colorado. It was reported that he had been informed that the operators will grant an eight-hour day, recognition being waived. It was also decided to reject any proposition that may come from the United Mine Workers.

Dowie, however, declares his people will work for nothing provided they are furnished with food. SWEDISH SHIP ASHORE

Crew Landed by the Aid of Breeches Buoy—Will Be Total Wreck.

Lewes, Del., Dec. 3.—The eleven members of the crew of the Dharwar, which was ashore a few miles from Ocean City, Md. The main topmast has been carried away. It is feared the vessel will be a total wreck as a heavy sea is running and the wind is blowing thirty-five miles an hour. The North Beach life savers have been unable to launch a lifeboat to rescue the crew. The wrecking steamer North America has left the Delaware breakwater to go to the assistance of the ship. Five members of the crew of the Dharwar came ashore in one of the ship's boats. The remainder of the crew, eleven in number, and a woman and two children, are still on the vessel. The Dharwar is hard aground.
