


PIONEER JOHN TINGEY IS DEAD



JOHN TINGEY.

John Tingey, who came to Salt Lake City five years ago after President Brigham Young and his pioneers crossed the plains, died yesterday morning at his late residence, 130 North Second West street. Old age was the immediate cause of death. Mr. Tingey was 82 years of age and leaves three sons and two daughters—State Auditor Charles S. Tingey, Frank S. Tingey, member of the hardware department of the Z. C. M. L.; Joseph S. Tingey, who is connected with the Deseret News; Mrs. E. L. Sloan and Mrs. W. F. Nebeker. The funeral will take place Tuesday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the Seventeenth ward meeting house.

DEATH OF A PIONEER

Mrs. Sophia Jones, an Old Resident of Utah, Passes Away.

Mrs. Sophia Jones, an old resident of Utah, died at the residence of her daughter, Mrs. J. W. Jones, 24 Center street, yesterday afternoon at 12:45. Mrs. Jones was in her 82d year. Death was caused by old age and general debility. Mrs. Jones was born in Denbigh, Denbighshire, North Wales, Sept. 2, 1822. She was the wife of the late William Jones of Samaria, Ida., who died about one year ago. The deceased leaves four children, twenty-eight grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren. Friends can view the remains at 254 Center street this afternoon from 3 to 5 p. m. The body will be shipped to Samaria, Ida., for interment.
