

LESS WAR TALK IN THE FAR EAST

No Indication of When the Russian Reply Will Be Sent.

JAPAN'S WAITING ATTITUDE

BULLETINS HAVE CEASED TO BE EXCITING.

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 21.—The foreign office does not offer any indication of when the Russian reply to Japan will be ready.

The papers are still disposed to seek pretexts to attack the action of the United States, considerable ammunition being wasted on the alleged decision to send the American Asiatic squadron to Yonampoo, on the Yalu river.

The war minister's order to convert twelve reserve battalions into regular troops has been approved so far as the present situation is concerned, the order having been issued last February.

DEPENDS UPON JAPAN.

War May Be Forced Upon Russia in the End.

London, Jan. 21.—The Westminster Gazette this afternoon voices official and general opinion on the far eastern crisis, saying:

"We believe the chances of peace are at this moment more favorable than they have been for some weeks past."

The Associated Press learns that even Lord Lansdowne, who has been constantly pessimistic, yesterday expressed the belief that war would be averted.

The diplomats here, though differing in views as to the outcome, all agree that the dispute is not likely to be settled without another depressing period, which is expected to occur when the war party in Japan raises its inevitable objections after the receipt of the pending Russian reply.
