

OTHER TRACKS WELL COVERED

No Clue to the Men Who Held Up Oregon Express.

DETECTIVES LOOKING WISE BUT UNABLE TO TURN UP ANYTHING TANGIBLE.

Redding, Cal., April 3.—No arrest has yet been made in connection with the holding up of the Oregon express Thursday night at Copley. William Ahern, the railroad detective, said tonight:

"The people seem to expect that we must capture them by tonight. If not today at least tomorrow. They forget that the robbers probably planned their escape for a month before holding up the train. We cannot turn around in a day or two and uncover their tracks, especially when we have absolutely nothing to work on."

The work being done by officials now is principally that done by detectives. A vague number was added to today by J. J. White of San Francisco, representing Wells, Fargo & Co. Sheriff Richardson is adding them in every way possible. Everything they say in demand when the bandits are located at present. Since the Kennet clew of yesterday, the detectives are making a complete alibi, the situation as regards the apprehension of the robbers is as dark as it was on the morning subsequent to the killing of Messenger O'Neil. The detectives are following up every possible clew.

Robbers at Home.

They have worked from the first on the belief that the train robbers reside in this vicinity. They have not been able to show that. None but men perfectly familiar with the territory could have given the directions to Engineer Joenski that the three masked men hid as they hurriedly reached their draw away from the scene of their crime.

"That makes it one of the hardest kind of cases," said a detective. "The highwaymen reach their homes, dispose of all signs of their crime, resume their air of respectability, and in such an affair as this where there is nothing to make it as if it were an awful hard case to ferret out."

Detectives at Work.

The detectives were working along different lines today. Ahern and White went north on a freight, not giving out their destination. It is believed that a journey was made to acquaint White, who arrived here only this morning, with the scenes of the crime. C. C. White, who was in charge of the Southern Pacific company, spent last night at Keswick and returned to the smelter town today. He is believed to give out as to the line of his O'Brien stay in Redding today. Constable E. Eldridge and Deputy Sheriff O'Brien went out to the Sulphur Creek section of the Buckeye region and ran down a false rumor, a matter had reported as if a man sat washing a pan of dirt for gold three armed strangers passed near him and failed to answer his questions. The officers found that the three men were residents of the neighborhood and upon them to answer the greeting of a stranger.

A Possible Clue.

Six weeks after the Weaverville stage was held up last year the officers learned that immediately after the holding three suspicious characters occupied a cabin for several days on the north fork of Clear creek, at a point in the mountains out of the view of the sheriff. Foster left this afternoon for the cabin, working on the theory that the men who held up the train were in the old cabin and may again be rendezvoused in the old cabin in the mountains. The report that the cabin is located south of Anderson, twelve miles south of Redding, which was made by a man who had been in a store there. The salesman says he is able to give a good description of the purchases.

Ex-Convict Recognized.

A peculiar case came up today. Detective Ahern received photographs of two men who were recently liberated from the state's prison. He recognized one of them in this part of the state. It was thought that the ex-convict might be connected with the robbery. The man who was held as a witness by the first person encountered by the robbers. As he was starting to get into the holdup, Copley the masked man came into the holdup and proceeded to carry out their plans. The photograph is one of him. The officers do not connect him with the holdup.

BATTLE BEGINS FOR THE NORTHERN PACIFIC ROAD

"Whereas, This company has issued and there are now outstanding 3,541,000 shares of its own capital stock; and

"Whereas, This company desires and intends to comply with the decree in the said suit, fully and unreservedly, and without delay;

"Resolved, In consideration of the premises, it is declared to be necessary that the present capital stock of this company be reduced to three million, and that the shares of this company be distributed among its shareholders the shares of capital stock of said company held by them;

"Resolved, That the board of directors of this company hereby declares it advisable that articles of incorporation be amended so as to read as follows:

"Fourth—The capital stock of this company is hereby reduced to three million, one hundred and fifty-four thousand dollars (\$3,544,000) and shall hereafter be three million, one hundred and fifty-four thousand dollars (\$3,544,000) and shall be divided into one hundred thousand (\$100) each. "The board of directors, or executive committee, from time to time shall make such rules and regulations as may seem necessary or convenient for carrying out the provisions hereof, and all matters pertaining to the said stock retirement of the stock of this company, or to the assignment and transfer of the stock of the said railway companies, and the number of shares held by them respectively shall be determined from the stock transfer books of this company, in which for such determination shall be closed at a day and hour to be determined by resolution of the board.

"Stockholders Meeting.

"Resolved, That a meeting of the stockholders of this company for the purpose of taking action upon the said alteration of the articles of incorporation of this company, and also upon said other business as may come before the meeting, be and is hereby called to be held at the general offices of this company in the city of Hoboken, county of Hudson, State of New Jersey, at 11 o'clock a. m. on April 2, 1904.

COMMENT UPON TIBET AFFAIR

Russia Sees No Cause For Alarm in the Situation.

CURZON DOES NOT COUNT

KING EDWARD NOW AT THE HELM IN ENGLAND.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 3.—The newspapers continue to discuss the British expedition in Tibet and the speech of the viceroy of India, Lord Curzon of Kedleston, March 30, at Calcutta (when he reviewed the last five years of Indian administration and referred to the government's watchful policy), but most of them in a singularly dispassionate tone.

The Bourse Gazette openly suggests that King Edward is planning an entente between Great Britain and Russia, and then says: "There is no need for alarm. We have been accustomed since the days of Disraeli and Salisbury to veiled threats (referring to Lord Curzon's speech). Indian Secretary Brodick's announcement of big guns for India have broken no bones, nor is any one frightened by the forthcoming British naval demonstration in the Mediterranean. The fact is that the British foreign policy is now in the hands of a man who has been in office all his life, and who knows all we know that a sincere, peaceful and loyal influence is being exerted by King Edward. There is no longer doubt of British neutrality, and there is no reason for apprehension regarding the promise of a friendly agreement with Russia concerning Tibet. We are only curious to see how Great Britain will explain armed aggression with a Chinese province."

The Russ says that Great Britain took a leaf out of Japan's book on the way to open hostilities by attacking the Tibetans without a declaration of war.

The Novoe Vremya says: "Two American millionaires have changed the destinies of India. Since Lord Curzon became Lord Kitchener's brother-in-law their personalities seem to have been merged. Curzon spoke with the words of Kitchener on the glacial theory and Lord Curzon adopted the policy of Curzon in sending an alleged diplomatic mission into Tibet. The glacial theory is all right so long as it has to do with unarmed foes."

The mistake of the Novoe Vremya in speaking of Lord Curzon and Lord Kitchener as brothers-in-law probably emanates from a rumor in circulation some time ago that Lord Kitchener was to marry Miss Daisy Leiter, a sister of Lady Curzon.

The glacial theory to which the Novoe Vremya refers was contained in Lord Curzon's Calcutta speech, in which he said that India resembled a fortress beyond whose walls there existed on one side a glacier of varying breadth and dimensions, which they did not desire to occupy, but which they could not afford to see occupied by a foe.

HIS HAND AMPUTATED.

London Correspondent in the Thick of the Fight.

London, April 4.—Mr. Candier, the correspondent of the Daily Mail, who was wounded during the fighting between the British and the Tibetans at Guru, March 31, and whose left hand has been amputated, thus describes the attack upon him: "I was watching the Tibetans being disarmed, when I was attacked by a swordsman. This was before a shot had been fired. The swordsman was too sudden for me to draw my revolver. I caught the Tibetan around the knee and threw him, but was myself dragged down, and in trying to rise, was cut down by several swordsmen. These were eventually shot."
