TRAINS ON MOFFAT ROAD.

Regular Service Began For Forty-Seven Miles—Statement Issued.

Denver, Colo., June 23.—Regular train service on the Denver, Northwestern & Pacific railroad (the Moffat line), between Denver and Mammoth, a distance of forty-seven and one-half miles, was inaugurated yesterday with a monster dedicatory excursion of about seventy miles.
