In 1899 Mr. Thomas graduated from the law division of the Michigan university. He was a candidate for city judge on the Democratic ticket two years ago, but was defeated with the rest of the ticket. Since then he has practiced law in this city, besides taking an active part in church work. In that line Mr. Thomas' duties have been with the Young Men's Mutual Improvement association. He is superintendent of Ensign state. Speaking of his appointment last evening, Mr. Thomas said: "I look upon it as a great honor and feel equally complimented. It is a position which any man might fill and feel that an honor had been conferred upon him. While I am in office I will do my best to serve the schools and the citizens of Salt Lake city alike. My one endeavor will be to perpetuate the good name of the schools now enjoyed, and to everything in my power to raise their standard."

No Action on Art Supervisor.

The matter of the employment of an art supervisor also came up in executive session, but no final action was taken on the names of Miss May Teasdale, who had charge of the department of the High school, and D. W. Farratt, who was assistant manual training instructor and helped in the art work last year in that branch of the public schools. One faction of the board opposed the creation of such a position, on the ground of expense, while the other thought it would be another step towards the educational advancement of the schools of the city. After considerable discussion by both sides it was decided to leave the matter open for the time being.
