Tokio, Sept. 7.—(8 p. m.)—The general staff has not yet made public any details of the battle of Liao Yang.

It is reported that the Japanese, notwithstanding the ravages of fire, captured vast accumulations of Russian stores and ammunition at Liao Yang.

No official report of the subsequent movements of General Kuropatkin has been received, but the Kokumin says it learns on good authority that Kuroki, after taking the heights near Helyingtai, about fifteen miles north-east of Liao Yang, occupied a line between Yen Tai and the river.

The Nichi Nichi says it thinks the Japanese cannot expect to succeed in the assault on Port Arthur, owing to their having occupied fortified positions in superior numbers.

MANY WANT CITY TO BUY PROPERTY Faust Company is Running Its Modern Plant—How the Butter is Made.

The new creamery of the Faust Creamery & Supply company, 551, 553 and 555 West Third South street, has been opened. This plant is located in a new three-story brick building with dimensions of 45x145 feet.

The company owns a number of creameries throughout Utah, and not only receives cream from its cream supply, but from farmers in Utah and Idaho who operate hand separators.

Before being put into the immense churns, the cream is passed through a machine which raises its temperature to 155 degrees and then lowers it to 35 degrees, thus completely pasteurizing it and destroying all disease germs that may be in the cream.
