LIVELY FIGHT IS ON

Republican Primaries Indicate Hollingsworth Will Beat Condon For Senate.

Republican primaries preliminary to Saturday's county convention were held throughout Weber county last night. In Ogden primary elections were held. The polls being kept open from 4 till 9 o'clock. The attendance was sixty voters, being the highest number of votes cast in any district, while many of the delegates in smaller districts went in with about a dozen votes, including those of the three judges. In the tenth, one of the largest districts of the city, no votes were cast. At the eleventh hour an effort was made to get some judges, but they were not secured until after 9 o'clock. There was strong aversion to serving as judges in all the districts.
