

CAMPAIGN FUND WAS ENORMOUS

Republican State Committee Had \$45,000 to Expend.

HOW MONEY WAS OBTAINED

EVERYBODY FORCED TO CONTRIBUTE.

NOTWITHSTANDING the many poverty talks made by representatives of the Republican state committee during the last campaign, it now develops that the committee had at its disposal the largest campaign fund in the history of the state. The total amounted to about \$45,000, of which \$25,000 came from the national committee and the remainder from Utah men and corporations. When the campaign opened the national committee sent \$12,500 and duplicated this amount toward the close of the campaign.

No financial statement has been given out by the state committee, so it is not possible to ascertain how much of the \$45,000 was expended. Some believe it was all scattered around in one way or another, while others believe about \$20,000 has been held back to aid in starting the new daily paper that has been so much discussed.

Everybody Levied Upon.

Some of the candidates on the state ticket were made to stand for two assessments, while others were favored by the group that controlled the committee's affairs—escaped after one touch. It is said Cutler was asked for \$5,000, while others were asked \$250. Sutherland contributed \$500 and Barich \$250. Straup is reported to have been stood up for \$1,000. Smelter interests came to with \$300. W. S. McGonick is said to have been pursued until he was separated from \$2,100.

Where Did the Money Go?

In the absence of a definite statement of expenditures, various committees are not on the "inside" have been trying to learn in a general way what was done with all this money. From \$15,000 to \$25,000 of it was spent in Salt Lake county, these members are told. About \$5,000 more was spent in buying the space of and circulating the two weekly papers the committee employed, is another explanation given. The "secret service" consisted of a host of "pluggers," hired to circulate among the voters for the purpose of disseminating stories—mostly false—concerning opposing candidates. The headquarters staff, it is explained, was large and high class, entailing much expense.
