

PEDAGOGUES IN ANNUAL MEETING

Eleven of the Crew of the Gallia Were Killed.

Hamilton, Dec. 28.—The Danish steamer Gallia, from Hamburg, Dec. 27 for Savannah, has arrived here with the survivors of the Norwegian bark Marpesia. Captain Jensen, from New York, Dec. 3, for Citta. The Marpesia was blown up by a mine, the explosion of her cargo of naphtha, and the crew, who were saved, landed here tonight.

The Marpesia carried out of the port of Savannah 25,000 gallons of naphtha, valued at \$125,000, and a cargo of New York were Benham & Lawson.
