

APPLIES TEST OF LEADERSHIP

Bishop C. F. Spalding Delivers Initial Sermon.

MESSAGE FOR HIS PEOPLE TAKES FOR TEXT, "CHRIST ALWAYS THE SAME."

The Right Rev. Charles Franklin Spalding, bishop of Salt Lake Episcopal mission, preached his initial sermon before the congregation of St. Mark's cathedral at 10 o'clock yesterday morning.

Remember those which have ruled over you, whose faith you know, whose faith you know, considering the end of our conversation, Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today and forever.

I take it this means that the test of the value of all the leadership, and teaching and preaching which you have received in the past is just this, to what degree has it commended to men's love and loyalty, Jesus Christ? And therefore the test of the value of all future leadership and preaching is, will it commend to men's love and loyalty, Jesus Christ? As a principle we all admit this, I am sure, as a working theory it is not so simple.

Significance of Text. The text seems to guard against the danger of diverse interpretations of Christianity by its exponents. "Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today, and forever." And yet can any one deny that there has been a vast change in the world's conception of Jesus Christ?

Truth vs. Truth Clothed. The meaning of the term we use—the way in which we express truth—is continually changing. New conditions make it need to be clothed in new and makes whether the illustrations we use explain or confuse.

Breadth of Church. This whole matter of the permanent and the changeable becomes more difficult still when we remember that we have in society at any one time men and women whose mental and spiritual outlook corresponds with centuries of historic development.

Then again: As conditions and needs differ with individuals so they differ in the various times and conditions of history and civilization. Take for example war and the right to resort to force of arms. We are coming more and more to understand that war is wrong, that the United States were to refuse to negotiate treaties with the nations of Europe, she could be falling into a howl, and yet who will for one moment deny that in the past there have been righteous wars.

We are quite clear today, that all men are not alike, and loyalty to any one made to see things alike. It takes time to tell the truth. The one who speaks it and the one who receives it. The study of the religious capacity of man has made us see that the diagnosis of the individual has quite as much to do with saving him as the purity of the medicine.

man morally and spiritually as efficient medicines propose to heal him physically. Dogmas, guaranteed to have spiritual value neatly labeled, were served to all who apply and to all alike. A more rational religious method will make it wise medical treatment which does not give the same dose to all, but vary carefully, diagnosing the case.

My Message to You. If in a single word and in a single sentence I have been saying, my message to you and my work with you is to be the message to the world by word and by example, Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today and forever.

Missions Past and Future. Please God, we are for a long time to work together. As we look over the past and try to estimate the future, we are already done, we thank God for that. Not that it has been so completely accomplished that the Christian will not for as to do, but that men of God did the things that he did, and that his effort is to endure, to conquer.
