Fascinating Region in Which Rich Ores Are Tantalizing.

ROCK SMELTS LIKE BUTTER

MANAGER ROOD AT CAMP TO RELIEVE A. D. MOFFAT.

In 1927 an eastern concern of some means and ability undertook to exploit the copper deposits in the country lying south of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado in Arizona and north of the San Francisco peaks and Bill Williams mountains...

Up to the construction of this road the canyon had not been touched by rail between Cremona in Utah and the Needles in California, a distance of some 300 or more miles.

Trouble in the promoting corporation and its branches threw the road into receivership, and it was sold by the receiver to people interested in the Santa Fe company...

The heavy travel of sightseers to the canyon and the display of the road along and near the line have resulted in the creation of fresh interest, so that this year may see another attempt at mining and promotion there.

There are ores, and very rich ores, approachable from the grass roads on the big mesa, in particular, the ore or lens-shaped bodies, in the upper stratum, which is limestone, and some of them are undoubtedly made by cleaning up the largest and best of them...

Physical Difficulties Many. The Grand Canyon clefs the mountain range all the way across, almost down to sea level, and discloses here and there veins of mineral running to the farthest distance of the canyon under the river.

Eureka (Nev.) Sentinel. The Mormon mining company, which has been taking advantage of the good times and high prices at Kawich, several of them recently went into the new camp with produce, beef and hay, and found a ready market.

These surface ores are very tantalizing. They run high in copper, smelt like butter and carry appreciable values in gold and silver.
