Though sporadic disorders still exist, there has been no general spread as was dreaded, but authorities have manifested their ability to cope with the situation.

Kuropatkin and Linevitch Acknowledge Receipt of Orders.

St. Petersburg, March 18.—A telegram from General Kuropatkin to Emperor Nicholas, dated March 17, says: "In accordance with the order of his majesty, received March 16, I handed over to General Linevitch today the command of the land and sea forces operating against the Japanese."




