

REMAINS IN THE FRENCH CABINET

M. Delcasse Reconsiders His Intention to Resign.

ALL CLASSES ARE PLEASED POWERFUL INFLUENCE WAS BROUGHT TO BEAR.

Paris, April 22, 4:15 p. m.—M. Delcasse has informed President Rouvier that he will retain the portfolio of foreign affairs.

Paris, April 22.—M. Delcasse's final decision upon his resignation as minister for foreign affairs was still in the balance up to noon, but powerful influences were at work to induce him to remain in the cabinet.

Letter Was Brief. The letter of M. Delcasse to Premier Rouvier giving the first intimation of his purpose to resign was very brief. It based his action solely on the ground of health, and made no allusion to any political or international consideration.

Possible Successors. The names of M. Etienne, now minister of interior, M. De Freycinet, former president of the council and minister of foreign affairs, Leon Bourgeois and Paul Cambon, ambassador of France to Great Britain, were prominently mentioned as successors to M. Delcasse should he insist on retiring.

Visit to Loubet. Responding to the personal request of President Loubet, M. Delcasse went to the Elysee palace at 11 a. m., where he had an interview with the president, which lasted half an hour.

British Are Pleasured. London, April 22.—The decision of M. Delcasse to retain control of the foreign office of France has been received with marked pleasure in political circles in London.


