UNCLE SAM BUYS MACHINE DRILLS

Compressor Plant and Full Equipment Being Shipped Today.

ALBION'S STRIKE A BIG ONE NEW YORK IN MARKET WITH \$3,000 WORTH OF ORE.

The management of the Uncle Sam Consolidated Mining company yesterday purchased from the Salt Lake Hardware company complete compressor plant, including a full complement of power drills. The machinery will be shipped out to camp today and within a week or ten days it is expected to have it in commission.
