

ORPHANS HAVE DAY OF PLEASURE

Go on Outing and Enjoy Life and Food to Fill. MANY HELP TO ENTERTAIN FATHERLESS AND MOTHERLESS APPEAL TO THEIR HEARTS.

Three hundred happy children, two-thirds of whom were inmates of the Kearns St. Ann's orphanage, ruled Salt Lake yesterday from mid-forenoon until 7 o'clock in the evening.

The orphans were everybody's guests of honor. While the chief responsibility fell upon the women in charge of the outing, dozens of other visitors to the resort insisted on sharing the pleasure of entertaining the little ones.

There were two leading events of the day—lunch and dinner. The first came at noon and the second at 2:30 p. m.

It was impossible to tell the orphans from their more fortunate playmates. There was no unlovely uniform to mark the inmates of the orphanage, nothing to make them appear different from other little boys and little girls.

There were no rules, yet a more orderly gathering of children could not be imagined. Unlike the famed "news-rioting," childish innocence and ignorance of the world were not factors on each face.

Some Show Tinge of Sadness. Yet the objects of sympathy were not at all sorrowful yesterday. Here and there one would detect a face that appeared to reflect some indefinable sadness.
