

CAPT. A. J. BURT CALLED BY DEATH

Victim of Disease Contracted While Serving in Philippines.

WAS SALT LAKE SHERIFF TWICE COMMISSIONED AS OFFICER IN VOLUNTEER FORCES.

Captain Andrew J. Burt, for many years one of the most widely known peace officers of Utah and later a volunteer officer in the United States army, died at his home, 555 First street, about 6 o'clock last evening.

Captain Burt returned from Manila in 1903 after two years' service in the army and on the police force there. His health was broken when he reached home, and although he gained strength during the first months after his arrival in Salt Lake, he never succeeded in shaking off the disease.

REGULATIONS ANNOUNCED FOR SHIPPING CATTLE UNDER THE 28-HOUR LAW

Washington, July 28.—Regulations for the shipment of livestock under the twenty-eight hour law in the matter of feed and rest of stock in transit, were completed today by the department of agriculture.

The regulations provide for the shipment of live stock without unloading at intermediate points.

"First, the cars containing the cattle shall be equipped with hay racks, each of which shall have a capacity not less than one cubic foot extending along the sides of the cars from the front to the end and that the cars shall be so arranged that the racks may be readily filled with hay through openings in the car roof.

"Second, the cars shall be fitted with semi-cylindrical watering troughs of galvanized or cast iron, not less than twelve inches wide across the top, and twelve inches wide across the inner edge curved to retain the water and facilitate filling.

"Third, food and water to be supplied at intervals not exceeding twenty-eight hours in the shipments are to be kept in the cars and the troughs shall be kept filled with clear water and all the animals given opportunity to drink.

"Fourth, in order that the cattle may have sufficient space and opportunity to rest, the cars shall not be overloaded and the shipments there shall be room in each car for at least one-third of the cattle to lie down at a single time.

"Fifth, the number of head of cattle that may be carried in a car, as shown in the following table, according to the live weight:
