

San Francisco Appeals for Help and Assistance

Congress Responds With an Appropriation of \$1,000,000, Passed Unanimously.

Every Part of Country Raising Money--Ships and Trains Being Loaded With Provisions.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 19.—The following appeal for aid has been sent out by Mayor Schmitz to Governor Pardee and shows the destitution of the people and the dire need of food and shelter:

"Send all supplies and tents possible to Golden Gate Park. Have bakeries in small towns bake all the bread they can. We want bedding, food and tents."

DOUBLED THE AMOUNT.

House Appropriated \$1,000,000 for the Homeless and Destitute.

Washington, April 19.—Mr. Tawney (Minn.), from the committee on appropriations, moved to the following substitute to the senate joint resolution, making appropriations for California's sufferers:

"Resolved, By the senate and house of representatives of the United States of America, in congress assembled, that the secretary of war is hereby authorized, and is directed to provide in open market or otherwise subsistence and quartermaster's supplies in addition to the supplies belonging to the military establishment, and available, and issue the same to such destitute persons as have been rendered homeless or are in needy circumstances, as a result of the earthquake which occurred April 18, and the attending conflagration, and in executing this joint resolution the secretary of war is directed to co-operate with the authorities of the state of California and the cities of San Francisco, Berkeley, Oakland, Alameda and such other cities on the Pacific coast as may have suffered damage. Be it further

Resolved, That the secretary of the treasury, the secretary of the navy and the secretary of commerce and labor are hereby directed to co-operate with the secretary of war in extending relief and assistance to the destitute people herein referred to to the extent of the use of the naval vessels, revenue cutters and other vessels, and give the supplies under their command on the Pacific coast. Be it further

Resolved, That to enable the secretary of war to execute the provisions of this joint resolution there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$1,000,000, to be expended under the direction and in the discretion of the secretary of war."

Larger Sum Needed. Mr. Tawney explained that the larger sum was absolutely needed; that secretaries of other departments were included in that naval vessels, cutters and the fish commission boat Albatross could be used.

The resolution was adopted at 2:30, within ten minutes of its being reported.

The substitute was reported on the ground that the amount should be doubled and that the secretary of war should be relieved from any statutory provision restricting the bids be secured for the needed supplies.

NOTED MEN IN CHARGE.

Finance Committee Appointed to Take Charge of Relief Work.

San Francisco, April 19, p. m.—The committee on safety consisting of fifty prominent citizens met with Mayor Schmitz this morning and organized a finance committee composed of James N. Pheasant, E. W. Heilman, Claus Spreckels, Flood, William Babcock, W. E. Hinckley, M. H. de Young and Robert J. Tobin.

Mayor Schmitz announced that the water company promised a supply of water this afternoon in the western addition which is being supplied by tomorrow. Committees were appointed to take charge of the relief of the destitute and the work was immediately begun and assumed some system.

Golden Gate park will be the main refuge and supplies will be sent there. Boats will be provided to take people across the bay and thousands are availing themselves of the privilege. The University of California has volunteered to take care of 2,000.

Mayor Schmitz has appointed his committee of citizens special officers with full power to represent him and with power to requisition men, supplies, vehicles and other property.

Supplies Needed at Once. These supplies are rushed in and arrangements are made for their distribution. Trouble is feared within a few days unless relief is obtained.

General Funston and Sumner, in command of the federal troops, are rendering aid to the relief of the people who go to the Presidio are being taken care of and the number that can be accommodated is being increased.

St. Louis Responds.

St. Louis, April 19.—Mayor Wells today issued a proclamation calling upon the citizens of St. Louis to render aid to the relief of San Francisco and vicinity.

He appointed a central relief committee of twelve to receive and forward contributions. Mayor Wells sent the following telegram to Mayor Schmitz of San Francisco:

"The people of the city of St. Louis deeply sympathize with the citizens of San Francisco in this hour of their terrible affliction and are ready to render any desired assistance in their power."

Rockefeller Gives \$100,000. New York, April 19.—John D. Rockefeller today authorized his agents in San Francisco to expend \$100,000 for the relief of the homeless and destitute of that city.

Thousands of Tents Shipped. Philadelphia, April 19.—Pursuant to the order issued this morning by Secretary of War Schmitz, 10,000 tents were shipped to San Francisco this city today shipped to San Francisco 3,500 conical tents, all that were available in the depot.

Free Transportation. New York, April 19.—Wells, Fargo & Co. announce that they will transport supplies for the sufferers at San Francisco free of charge which are addressed to any San Francisco relief association or public official who may have charge of the distribution of it.

Sympathy From South Seas. Sydney, N. S. W., April 19.—The premiers of New South Wales and Victoria have jointly sent to President Roosevelt the sympathy with the United States in the disaster at San Francisco.

Pennypacker's Offer. Harrisburg, Pa., April 19.—Governor Pennypacker today sent the following telegram to Governor Pardee of California:

"If any help is needed in San Francisco that Pennsylvania can render let me know."

Thanks for Polk's Offer. Sacramento, April 19.—Governor Pardee today sent the following dispatch to Governor Polk of Missouri in reply to an offer of aid for San Francisco sufferers:

"We thank you for your offer of aid. There are thousands of homeless people in San Francisco and other towns and food and shelter must be furnished. At the same time, the people of the east should understand that the area affected by earthquake is only about one-fifth of the whole. The great Sacramento and San Joaquin valleys and all the northern and southern portions of the state escaped the disaster."

Raised \$50,000 in Twenty Minutes. Sacramento, Cal., April 19.—Citizens of Sacramento at an impromptu meeting on the court house steps in this city this morning raised \$50,000 in twenty minutes for the relief of the earthquake and fire sufferers in San Francisco.

New Orleans Stands Ready. Washington, April 19.—The following telegram was received today at the war department from William Mason Smith, president of the New Orleans Cotton exchange:

"Many citizens of New Orleans, represented by the cotton exchange, desire to extend the most rapid and useful aid to San Francisco. We see that your department is in touch with General Funston, the military commander, and we would be glad if you can tell us if we can best help by money or provisions by special train to San Francisco."

Great Heart of Indiana. Indianapolis, April 19.—After a consultation with a number of Indianapolis business men at noon today, Mayor Schmitz at San Francisco sent the following telegram to Mayor Schmitz at San Francisco:

"The people of Indianapolis authorize you to make a draft upon me for \$10,000 for the relief of the suffering people of your city."

Mayor Dunne's Message. Chicago, April 19.—Mayor Dunne returned from his eastern trip today and at once reaching his office sent the following message to Mayor Schmitz at San Francisco:

"Accept Chicago's most profound sympathy for the great affliction. In what way can we best give you relief?"

Philadelphia Sends \$25,000. Philadelphia, April 19.—The permanent relief committee met today and decided to send \$25,000 to San Francisco. Barclay H. Warburton, publisher of the Evening Telegraph today sent a telegram to Mayor Schmitz of San Francisco that he is preparing relief train and that he would notify the mayor when it would leave Philadelphia.

Messages Go Free. New York, April 19.—President Clowry of the Western Union Telegraph company made this announcement today: The Western Union will transmit free domestic messages relating to the relief of sufferers at San Francisco, when offered by Mayor Schmitz of San Francisco or public officers in their official capacity.

Seattle Raising Funds. Seattle, April 19.—At 11 a. m. the Times reports that it has raised \$1,000 for San Francisco sufferers and that the money is still coming in. It is expected the \$10,000 more will be added by noon.

Portland's Great Charity. Portland, Ore., April 19.—In addition to the \$10,000 raised by the Portland Relief Association, a committee of citizens today raised \$1,000 more, making a total of \$125,000 for the relief of the San Francisco earthquake sufferers.

St. Paul to the Rescue. St. Paul, April 19.—Mayor Smyth has sent a telegram to Mayor Schmitz of San Francisco, extending the sympathy of the city of St. Paul and offering any aid that can be needed.

Call to Nebraska People. Lincoln, Neb., April 19.—Governor Mickelthwait issued a call to the people of Nebraska to contribute to a fund for the benefit of the sufferers in San Francisco. The governor sent messages to Governor Pardee offering aid.

School Children at Work. Bellingham, Wash., April 19.—Mayor Black has called on the citizens to contribute to the relief of the San Francisco sufferers, and has appointed a committee to take charge of subscriptions. The school children are being organized to make a canvass.

COLLEGE TOWN READY TO OPEN TO REFUGEES

Victims at San Francisco Find Refuge at the University of California.

WOMEN ARE BAKING BREAD

STUDENT CADETS DETAILED FOR GUARD DUTY.

Berkeley, Cal., April 19.—Extraordinary relief work for the benefit of the vast population which was rendered homeless by the San Francisco earthquake is being achieved by a local citizens' committee headed by Rev. E. L. Parsons, pastor of St. Mark's Episcopal church.

President Wheeler has thrown open the grounds of the University of California to the weary refugees from the burning city across the bay and the churches have undertaken the task of supplying great quantities of food.

Meals Served in Tent. Meals will be served from a great tent which has been erected under campus conditions, while sleeping accommodations will be provided by strewing the baseball grounds with a deep layer of straw.

All the parish houses of the Episcopal churches of the city have been opened over to the use of the homeless and charitably inclined citizens are giving their extra home accommodations to those from across the bay.

Berkeley Women Baking Bread. A special request has been sent to the women of Berkeley to bake all the bread they possibly can, as there is a distressing bread famine on the other side of the bay.

Medical Attention Provided. Medical attention for a large number of persons injured in the San Francisco earthquake and subsequent fire is being provided in Berkeley. The local hospitals have been thrown open and the medical men of the university town are bending over their work.

Students on Guard Duty. While every attention is to be given by the citizens of Berkeley to the homeless San Franciscans, care will be taken to prevent any lawlessness during the time that the university grounds and buildings of the college town are thrown open.

Pouring into Oakland. Thousands of Refugees Wandering in the Streets. Oakland, Cal., April 19.—Oakland, the largest suburb of San Francisco, tonight housed and fed probably 50,000 refugees of the fire-stricken city across the bay.

Throng of Loiterers. During the greater part of the day there has been a throng of people loitering around the Seventh street depot. Many of them are residents of Oakland who have no work to do and are waiting for relief.

Stock Exchange Generosity. New York, April 19.—Eighty-five thousand dollars for the relief of San Francisco was raised on the stock exchange within twenty minutes today.

Supplies From Bellingham. Bellingham, Wash., April 19.—The steamer Olympia sailing at 4:30 carries in large quantities to San Francisco. The soldiers themselves are contributing their belongings to swell the shipments.

HARROWING TALE OF EYE WITNESS. Vivid Description of the Destruction of Mighty City by a Business Man Who Escaped. INCIDENTS OF AWFUL DAY. PITIFUL SCENES IN STREETS OF SAN FRANCISCO.

Incidents of Awful Day. Salinas, Cal., April 19.—(By Long Distance Telephone to Los Angeles.)—J. P. Anthony, a business man of Pacific Grove, arrived in this city this morning having made the trip from San Francisco by automobile. He left there at 6 o'clock last evening. Mr. Anthony is the first eye witness to bring direct information from San Francisco. His story is graphic and complete. Mr. Anthony says that he was sleeping in the room at the Ramona hotel on Ellis street, near Mason, and was suddenly awakened at 5:25 yesterday morning. The first shock that brought him out of bed, he says, was appalling in its terrible force.
