



STROKE PROVED FATAL.

Provo, April 30.—Byron E. Wilmot, who was stricken with paralysis last Monday night, died this morning in his room over the postoffices, where he had been tenderly cared for by his daughters, Mrs. J. H. Denhalter and Mrs. W. C. Crawford during his illness. Mr. Wilmot was a native of Ohio, where he was born twenty-two years ago. Will Appoint Committee.

At the meeting of the finance committee this afternoon no plans were submitted for solving the financial troubles of the city, and that question still remains open for future consideration.

Berry, who is employed at the crusher floor of the mill, was attempting to dislodge a hammer which had come up in an ore car from the mine.
