Chicago, May 11.—The world's high run 18-inch ball, 2-in. was broken tonight by Willie Hoppe, who set the new mark at 207. The former record was held by Louis Cure, 255.

Hoppe made the record in his game with Jacob Schaefer, whom he defeated in eight innings by a score of 590 to 105.
