MISTAKES MADE BY JEWS

GREAT QUESTION FOR RUSSIA TO CONSIDER.

Vichy, France, June 19.—Count Witte, the former premier of Russia, who came here for a rest and to take the cure, his health being somewhat impaired by the hard work and worry of the premiership, refuses to be quoted in connection with Russian politics, taking the ground that it would be not only against his own personal interest, but also against the interests of his country.

WITTE'S VIEW OF THE SITUATION

Witte's colossal figure now bears a more confident air than when he was here for a rest and to take the cure, his health being somewhat impaired by the hard work and worry of the premiership, refuses to be quoted in connection with Russian politics, taking the ground that it would be not only against his own personal interest, but also against the interests of his country.

WITTE POINT OF VIEW.

The correspondent is unable to cable a direct interview with Witte, but can give the following brief review of the situation in Russia as looked upon possibly from Witte's point of view.

FAVORABLE TO JEWS.

It is generally known that Witte is favorable to the progressive development of Russia in their country by transforming order. Therefore he cannot approve of the action of the lower house of parliament, which, according to the count, is doing so much to develop the revolutionary body, and not only delays the reforms which it advocates, but contributes to create and maintain a state of chaos resulting from the conflict between the legislative and executive branches of the government.

PROVOKED THE CONFLICT.

The Jews of Russia had only one proper course to pursue and that was to insist that all rights granted other races be also granted to them, nothing more and nothing less.

AMERICANS APPROVE OF THE APPOINTMENT

Constantinople, June 19.—The announcement that president Roosevelt had appointed John G. A. Leishman ambassador to the United States to Turkey, has met with the approval of the American legation here to the rank of an embassy in causing much satisfaction in American missionary and commercial circles.
