


ALTA CLUB DECIDES TO ENLARGE BUILDING.

Additions and alterations to the Alta club building at Brigham and State streets, to cost \$50,000 or more, as the judgment of the board of directors may determine, were decided upon by the board at a special meeting called for that purpose last night.

This improvement will comprise additions on the south and east fronts of the club building, and there will be approximately twenty-five suites with baths, modern in every detail.

There will be a demand for quarters in the club house that could not be met, and additional room has become a necessity.

BIG TIDAL WAVE ON UTAH LAKE

Water Level Rises More Than Two Feet in Less Than Ten Minutes.

W. A. Knight, superintendent of the Utah lake pumping station, which is operated to pump water from Utah lake to the Jordan river, under an agreement between the three irrigation companies operating in Salt Lake Valley and Salt Lake City, was at the lake yesterday to secure a new outfit of belting for the pumping plant. The plant was put out of commission during the gale which blew at 8 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, and two men who were at work in the pumping plant had to beat a hasty retreat.

TOTAL TAX LEVY IS 35.1 MILLS

County Commissioners Make County Rate the Same as It Was Last Year.

The county commissioners yesterday fixed the tax levy for the county for 1906 and the county school levy for the same period. Both levies were made the same as those of last year. The general county levy is 4.5 mills, and the county school levy is 2.5 mills. This makes the total tax to be paid by the people of Salt Lake County this year 35.1 mills, as against 34.2 mills last year.

'WING KID' FALLS TO HIS DEATH

Pitches Down Stairway at 62 Commercial Street and Fractures Skull.

C. A. Carman, 29 years of age, familiarly known for years about Salt Lake as "Wing Kid," fell to his death down the stairway at 62 Commercial street about 3:30 o'clock yesterday morning. His skull was crushed above the right ear. He was picked up by the inmates of the house where he was sleeping. Later he was carried to the St. Mary's hospital. Shortly after the accident Dr. W. F. Boer was summoned to take care of the case. Before Carman was moved from the place Dr. Boer secured a collection of \$30.25 from the habitues of the street to defray the expenses at the hospital and his fee.

GARFIELD IS TO GET INTERURBAN

West Side Rapid Transit Promises to Extend Line to Smelter Town.

The West Side Rapid Transit company, controlled by L. L. Nunn, has filed an application for an extension of its existing franchise for a period of fifty years. This company owns and operates an electric road beginning at Second South and First West streets, and extending on the latter street to the Cannon farm, and thence to the Cannon farm. In the event that the extension of franchise is granted, the company will extend its line to Garfield, a distance of nineteen miles, and then to Bingham, giving the road a total of twenty-five miles.
