

FORTUNA MINE IS A BONANZA

Development Is Such That It Is Now Entitled to Rank With Camp's Big Mines.

WORLD OF ORE IS EXPOSED

PREPARATIONS NOW MAKING TO GO MUCH DEEPER.

"There is no longer any doubt as to the status of the Fortuna. It has already a large tonnage of ore in sight, and the character of the developments prove that it will shortly establish itself as one of Bingham's great tonnage producers."

This is the statement of Superintendent W. N. Rossberg, who returned to the city yesterday from the camp after a thorough inspection of the development work being prosecuted in the mine.

"We have now drilled for a distance of 90 feet on the strike on the Mayflower level and all the distance in ore," Mr. Rossberg continued. "The cross-cut has been run for a distance of 150 feet to the foot wall. Fifty feet of this cross-cut is exceptionally high grade milling ore. The other 100 feet is in ore of a lower grade, but still good ore for a mill of proper dimensions. All of this is the same class of rock as that found in the other big Bingham properties. A raise of 150 feet in this body of ore shows the same conditions, with the face of the raise showing fully three feet of high-grade shipping ore. Sections of this high-grade ore are quite general along the main fissure. The cross-cut into the hanging wall shows strong mineralization of the same general character, beginning the cross-cut with 4 per cent copper and falling off to 2 per cent in the face of the cross-cut 150 feet distant."

"We will be ready within the present month to sink a large working shaft several hundred feet. The ground is improving with every foot of advance and the shaft will undoubtedly be the means of developing even richer ore than any yet uncovered and, as all the present workings are on the tunnel level, it is safe to assume a much larger and richer body lower down. This is borne out by recent developments in surrounding properties at lower levels of from 500 to 1,000 feet."

"The Fortuna workings are now in one vast body of copper ore. All late developments go to demonstrate its vast extent, while the real big disclosures are still to come. The entire drift of 600 feet along the main fissure is in one continuous body of high-grade milling ore, sprinkled throughout with native copper and impregnated with sulphides that, separated, will assay from 30 to 40 per cent in copper."

"General conditions at the mine were never so good. There is twenty times as much shipping ore in sight today as ever before. The new bank house will be completed early in January. It will accommodate sixty-five men. The mine has facilities now for rapid development, including the new compressor. In fact, the property is in the best possible condition for the advancement of work in an even more aggressive manner than ever under the same successful management."

GOOD WYOMING PROSPECT.

Eighth Interest in Two Weeks' Old Prospect Sells for \$25,000.

An eighth interest in the Lumen-Williams Copper mine near Shoshoni, which was discovered only about two weeks ago, has been sold by Williams to Buffalo parties for \$25,000, says the Cheyenne Tribune.

The big copper vein in this mine was discovered while the company was excavating for a building north of Shoshoni in the Copper Mountain district. It is thirty-two feet wide and its length has not been determined. It runs 100 to the ton and on each side of the copper is a vein rich in gold. The company has just deposited \$50,000 in a Shoshoni bank for development work.

THE BINGHAM MARY IS OPENING UP SPLENDIDLY

M. F. Cunningham visited the Bingham Mary in Bingham yesterday in the interest of a number of shareholders in the company. He returns well pleased with what he saw of the property. The shaft is now down 400 feet and good progress is being made. The bottom of the shaft yesterday was in ore, which, in all likelihood, will prove to be an entirely new body. If this is the case, and this continues to the surface, there is already an immense body of ore which will require but little development to make it ready for shipment.

On the 100-foot level on the main contact the ore body is widening with advance in the drift. The face is now in solid ore, and the thickness of the body makes it certain that it will continue to the lower depths. Drifting is also being prosecuted on the 350 level and conditions here point to a strong chute of ore.

General conditions at the mine are good. The Bingham Mary is well equipped and it is on the verge of developments which in a very short time will place it on a large scale. The whole camp is now being stacked on the dump ready for shipment. The future of the property looks bright. The whole camp is a hive of industry, and the heavy producers surrounding the Mary are pushing work in every direction.

SIZING UP THE MINES OF NEVADA CONSOLIDATED

Pope Yeatman, managing director of the Nevada Consolidated and the Cumberland-Ely, arrived in camp last night, accompanied by L. G. Cannon, general manager of the Nevada Northern, says the White Pine News.

Mr. Yeatman will today make a tour of the mines under his control. He will visit the Veteran tunnel and the Calumet shaft to inspect the work of the miners engaged upon the development work, and may go to the properties at Copper Flat.

"My trip possesses no significance," said Mr. Yeatman, at the Hayes Park hotel, last night. "I am here merely to keep myself informed concerning the work that is being done."

Manager Cannon of the Nevada Northern railroad, said that C. H. Beatty, superintendent of motive power, will retire on the first of the year. Mr. Beatty has been in charge of the Nevada Northern since the death of Mr. Beatty. He came in from Coburn last evening.

Mr. Cannon will today make a trip up Robinson canyon to see what has been done in the Nevada Northern to the mines. He will not accompany Mr. Yeatman, as the officials have separate interests to engage their time.

MERCUR MINING NEWS.

Local Men Have Good Thing in Arizona—Preacher Makes a Strike.

Mercur, Dec. 29.—The Hermit property, situated in the Grand Canyon of Arizona, is proving up in fine shape. It has been run in on the vein for about 115 feet, where there were indications of a good ore body beneath. Accordingly arrangements were made to sink at this point. As the sinking progressed the values increased with every shift, until the entire bottom of the vein is now in ore running 20 per cent copper. A large majority of the stock of this company is held in Mercur, the principal stockholders being J. W. Lee, A. R. Teeples and H. C. Nelson, all of this town.

Mr. Lee, the manager of the company, announces that a larger force will be put to work next week and development will be pushed with greater vigor. The company has under consideration the erection of an aerial tram and a matting plant. When these improvements are installed there will be nothing in the way of the company being in the market with regular shipments of copper.

Rev. Mr. Banc, formerly the pastor of the First Methodist church of this place, came into town last week with some samples of gold ore that made the natives' eyes bulge. The samples were obtained in Millard county and the owner has returned to perfect his title to the claims.

The coal situation at the Consolidated Mercur is but slightly improved. While there is enough of coal to suffice for the use of the town and for the heating of the mill there is not a sufficient amount accumulating to justify the company in starting up the roasting department of the mill yet.

COPPER-GOLD MINE IN SOUTHERN COUNTRY

Modena, Dec. 29.—Twenty-five miles east of Modena is a group of copper-bearing claims, owned by the recently incorporated Associated Copper Mining company, of which L. J. Ross of Wichita, Kan., is president. The property has been thoroughly prospected and gives promise of becoming an early shipper of profitable ores. A trial shipment of several tons from a forty-foot shaft, dug principally by leaching from the main vein, yielded 12 per cent copper, eight ounces in silver and \$2 in gold. About 20 feet of standard work has just been let and A. E. Ackerman of Denver is on the ground to superintend the mine development.

The main vein is six feet across and carries up to 25 per cent copper in flotation on one side and porphyry on the other.

The property was originally owned by the Thornton Brothers, well known in this section, who are said to have pulled down a handsome cash stipend for the majority of their holdings, and a stock consideration for the balance. This particular section has been more or less prospected for years, but before this sufficient depth was reached to disclose the real values.

ELECTRIC ORE HAULAGE FOR TINTIC DISTRICT

An electric railroad for the hauling of ore from the mines that are quite a distance from the railroad is the latest improvement planned for the Tintic district, says the Eureka Reporter.

Only recently a gentleman who is familiar with this kind of an enterprise was here to look over the ground and see if the business would be sufficient to justify the building of a line of this kind and the report which he turned in was highly satisfactory. The course of the proposed line is around the district from the Beck Tunnel to Eureka, which would make it possible to handle the output of all of the mines in that part of the district. If the new matter is built, and there is every reason to believe that it will be, such a line will be almost a necessity, as the haul who are back of this proposition would prefer not to be dependent upon the railroad companies for the switching of ore from the mines here.

It would not be a very expensive matter to put in an electric road to Tintic for the reason that the water power available from the Telluride Power company, which according to all reports is interested in the new road.

BINGHAM-NEW HAVEN LOWER TUNNEL SHOWING

The lower tunnel at the Bingham New Haven, which was started some time ago to tap the vein at a depth of 500 feet lower than the present workings, has now been driven a distance of about 300 feet, says the Bingham Press.

The tunnel reached a body of ore hitherto unsuspected and which no change has been made in the plans of the company. It has been passing through the ledge ever since, and so far has not reached the other wall. About seventy-five feet of the tunnel is in ore of a good quality, the percentage in copper being above the average, while the lead and silver is equal to the values in the upper workings.

The strike is in no way surprising, as it seems as if the district is heavily mined in every part. The large body of ore, however, being passed through assures the camp of another big mine, with many years of production ahead.

Tintic Mining Notes.

(Eureka Reporter.) Owing to the condition of the wagon road it has been impossible to haul the boilers up to the Annadale property at Mammoth. Some of the lighter pieces of machinery, as well as the lumber, brick, etc., for the building, are now at the property, and the boilers, compressor and engine will be taken up as soon as the roads are in better shape. Sinking is still going on and the shaft is now down over sixty-five feet.

It is stated that a rich strike was made at the Scranton recently in new territory which adds greatly to the immense amount of ore exposed in this mine. The Scranton has made another contract which will enable the shipment of a larger tonnage of the zinc ore. The force at the mine will be increased after the first of the year, which will mean a big increase in the output of both lead and zinc ores.

S. E. Ware, superintendent of the Swansea mine at Silver City, was in Eureka last Saturday and stated that the retrimbering of the shaft had been completed and that the usual force had once more been put to work breaking down ore. The Swansea is not a "has been" by any means, as the stockholders were allowed to draw down a little Christmas money last week in the form of a \$300 dividend.

The Sutherland brothers are still leasing at this property, in addition to the work which is being done by Superintendent Ware's force. It is reported that a new company will start work upon the old Dagmar property, to the north of Eureka, early next spring. The Defender group of claims to the west of the old West Cable, which
