

RETAIL BUSINESS SHOWS DECREASE AS RESULT OF STREET CAR TIE-UP

Salt Lake retail merchants suffered loss yesterday, the first business day of the strike, through the tie-up of the street cars.

Continued from Page 1. Aside from the wage question and the matter contained in the formal agreement before mentioned, the chief points in the fourteen articles submitted by the men were agreed upon.

SEVEN CARS ARE FORCED OUT OF COMMISSION ON CLOSING DAY OF STRIKE

Attempts by the Utah Light & Railway company to operate its cars proceeded without molestation for a short time after the cars were run out at 7 o'clock yesterday morning, but early in the forenoon crowds of men and boys began to make trouble.

UNION MEN BEHAVE WELL

Members of the street car men's union were prominent in the streets during the day, except when they formed a parade. The men have been placed under military discipline and have been advised to keep out of sight when not summoned to a meeting or a parade.

ORGANIZED OBSTRUCTION

The first organized resistance came when car No. 40 of the Murray line, in charge of Division Superintendent Jack Williams as motorman and Spotted as conductor, moved north on Main on its return trip.
