

SUFFICIENT TO OUST STANDARD

Report of Commissioner Appointed to Take Evidence in Missouri Oil Case.

UP TO THE SUPREME COURT MAY AFFIRM OR REMAND THE CASE.

Jefferson City, Mo., May 24.—Commissioner Anthony, appointed by the Missouri supreme court to take testimony in the ouster suit of the state against the Standard Oil company, today made his report to the court. He holds that the evidence introduced is sufficient to oust the Standard Oil company and tributary companies from Missouri.

Year's Work on Case.

Judge Anthony of Freericktown, Mo., was appointed by the supreme court to take testimony and report his findings to the court. More than a year has been occupied in the taking of the testimony, witnesses having been examined in New York, St. Louis and other cities.

FROM SALT LAKE TO ELY, NEV.

New Tariff Sheet in Which Reductions on Many Commodities Are Made.

OGDEN ALSO BENEFITED

(Special to The Herald.) Ely, Nev., May 24.—The Nevada Northern Railway company, in connection with the Oregon Short Line, the Union Pacific and the Southern Pacific Railway companies, has issued a new tariff sheet, which makes material reductions on many commodities which will be shipped from Salt Lake and Ogden.

The reductions, which will go into effect June 15, are horizontal, affecting virtually every class of commodities, and averaging nearly 32 per cent. In some classes, notably certain kinds of building material, the reductions are much greater, being 50 per cent.

"I charge that the motives of Mr. Spreckels and his associates are base and selfish, and that they are engaged in a scheme to injure the public interest by the use of force and intimidation to the detriment of the welfare of the people.

Vindication Promised.

"To my friends throughout the country I give the assurance that these indictments are not founded on facts, and there is no evidence that could justify them and that my associates and I will vindicate our names.
