Rents Are Going Up and Public Is Not Disposed to Change Habitations.

BUSY WEEK FOR RETAILERS

ACTIVITY IS SHOWN IN ALL LINES OF BUSINESS.

While the past week has been quiet commercially, the volume of business transacted averages up well with the business of the previous weeks this spring.

Rentals are steadily going up and the houses are getting fewer. As June 1 approaches and families prepare to move, the situation, which has been trying all winter and spring, gets worse, and it looks more as though this would be the lightest moving year the city has experienced.

The situation in building operations about the city is largely responsible for this condition of affairs at present. The high prices of lumber and the scarcity of facing brick, together with the demands of practically every class of skilled and unskilled workmen in the city for higher wages, has tied up a considerable amount of building.

The Salt Lake Savings & Trust company has formally opened its new safety deposit vaults to the public. The new institution is a credit to the city.

The dealers are up in arms over the refusal of the abstractors of the county to grant them a larger discount on paid bills than they are granting the general public.

The jobbers are laying in fall and winter stuff. The lines of summer goods are about cleaned out.


The retailing is having a busy time, despite the inclement weather of the past few days.
