SEVEN TROUGHS MAKING HISTORY

Buckhorn Is Proving One of the Biggest Sensations of the Camp.

Ben T. Lloyd, of the Seven Troughs Vernon company, returned from a trip to the new Eldorado of Nevada yesterday morning. He states that most sensational disclosures are being made in the Seven Troughs-Buckhorn company's Buckhorn property, better known as the Moller ground, at Vernon. On Friday last the grab samples taken from the buckets of ore raised during the day from the bottom of the 15-foot shaft were assayed, and the result was \$48 per ton in gold. The entire shaft is in ore and there is nothing to indicate where either end is. There is a sixteen-inch streak running through this mass, Mr. Lloyd states, that assays \$250 per ton in gold. The property is the wonder of the southern end of the district. Mr. Lloyd's company's ground adjoins the Moller ground on the south and in the two shafts going down gold ore is now being uncovered, though no work has yet been done on the Buckhorn ledge, which he says cannot escape running through the Vernon company's ground.

Between the town of Vernon and Signal Peak, about three miles to the north, no less than fifteen shafts are now going down on as many as a dozen different properties, and every one of them is in ore, some of it running into the picture values. These shafts are from fifty to fifty to 300 feet deep, the latter being on the Seven Troughs Mining company's property, the Knight-Holbrook combination's ground.

PRIVATE CAR PARTY LEAVES FOR ELY CAMP

A private car party of big mining operators and their friends pulled out for Ely last night. It was impossible to get the names of all who went on the trip of inspection, but included in the party was David Keith, president of the party, King Colleton Mines company; Thomas Kearns, general manager; James Ivers of same company; C. W. Whittier, local contractor; R. E. Wells, general manager of the Salt Lake Route, and James F. Dunn, superintendent of motive power on the Oregon Short Line.

The party also includes other mining men and engineers, but who they are could not be learned. They are going to camp to look over the McDonald-Ely and a number of other properties in the district, the big milling and smelting works of the Nevada Consolidated and the lead mines of the Success company. In the Duck Creek district, which are controlled by the Silver King crowd, and which are located about six or eight miles back in the hills from the smelter works going up at McGill.

SUITS AFFECTING MINES.

Judge Armstrong yesterday heard the arguments in the action brought by Fred Peterson et al. against M. L. Lyon, the Lyon Mining company, and the other defendants, to prevent the sale of the stock of the defendant company under an alleged assessment, which it is claimed was illegally made, until an accounting can be had. Irregularities in the management of the company are charged.

Bingham Standard Copper got a jolt yesterday. After opening at 63c it sold back to 56c, while 55c was the best closing bid for the stock. Crown Point made a couple of trades at 54c, Nalidiver brought 8c. Seven Troughs Signal Peak 15c, Mason Valley \$1.75 and Ohio-Kentucky 15c.

REAL GOODS AT GREENWATER FIND A BIG MINE

Fifty Feet of Copper Ore Showing Sulphides Cut at Depth of 400 Feet.

Greenwater, Cal., June 20.—The crosscut on the 400 level of Queen No. 2 of the Greenwater Copper Mine & Smelter company exposes fifty feet of copper ore, mineral of the concentrating order, developed under the direction of Jerry Rourke, the manager of the company, while drifting on that level toward Queen No. 2. The company has encountered the zone of secondary enrichment as against the oxidized and somewhat more barren exposures of the crosscut on the 100 level. The ore encountered is a high-grade copper with a blending of the cuprite with copper glance used with a mixture of enargite and the favorable pyrite.

Hunting Borax, Found Free Gold.

About three miles from the recent rich copper strike on the Baltic and Greenwater Nevada, in Willow creek, Richard Goldworthy discovered free gold. The dyke was being prospected for borax, but the borate returns were not flattering. With persistent prospecting Mr. Goldworthy ran into free gold. A test sample made by Kennedy and Lass gave a return of 22 1/2 per cent. The gold is in a white chalk-like quartz and pans freely. The lead is large, but sufficient work has not been done to class it as other than a most favorable discovery.

PROPERTY NEAR THE DIXIE RESPONDS TO WORK IN UNEXPECTED MANNER.

A mine already made is what is claimed for the property of the Black Warrior company, just over the hill from the Dixie copper bonanza of the Utah & Eastern company, near St. George, Washington county. A few months ago the National Development company of this city undertook the purchase of the claims from Bishop James Andrew, Jr. of St. George. D. C. Williams was sent down to superintend development and, within about six weeks time he has converted the proposition to a shipper of ore that averages better than 50 per cent lead and several ounces silver per ton.

At the end of a seventy-five-foot tunnel the force under Mr. Williams broke into a cave. This cave appeared to be filled with carbonate ore of a most desirable grade. He began sinking alongside the ore and the ground yielded so well that he has been able to go down the distance of 165 feet so far without trouble. He had the ore all the way and, upon his arrival from camp yesterday to make a trip into Nevada, he stated that one carload of the ore was on the road to market; that two more carloads are on the way and he would be able to ship a third carload within a few days. It is understood that the property was bought at a comparatively low price and that it has every appearance of proving a genuine bonanza.

Somebody must have tumbled to the fact that Columbus Consolidated of Alta is sending over \$100,000 worth of ore per month to market, and that another dividend will soon be passed around. MOVE IS MADE ON EMMA MINE

Second Payment on Purchase Price Turned Over and Work Begins at Once.

L. R. Martineau, who, with John A. Groesbeck, succeeded in closing a deal for the purchase of the famous old Emma mine, at Alta, early in the spring, announced yesterday that the second payment on the purchase price of the property had just been made and that every provision for taking care of the tax and final payment also had been made.

As soon as the old workings have been cleaned up and the management of the new company has got its bearings, a line of development will be carried out which is relied upon to bring the famous old bonanza to the front again. 
