FIGURES SHOW GREAT INCREASE Trade of United States with Latin-America More Than Doubled in Past Decade.

Washington, Aug.—Trade of the United States with the Latin-American countries aggregated more than \$900,000,000 in fiscal year just ended, against \$234,000,000 a decade ago. In this term, "Latin-American countries" are included, by the bureau of statistics of the department of commerce and trade, all of Central America, except British Honduras, all of South America except British and Dutch Guiana, and all of the West Indian islands except the under British, Dutch and Danish control.

The imports from Latin America in the fiscal year 1927 amounted to \$250,000,000, against \$150,000,000 in 1917, having thus a little more than doubled during the decade. From Mexico the imports in 1927 were \$57,000,000 in value, against \$15,000,000 in 1917, and the exports to that country in 1927 were \$26,000,000, against \$23,000,000 a decade ago.

From Central America the imports in 1927 were valued at \$10,000,000, against \$3,000,000 a decade earlier, and the exports thereto \$7,000,000, against \$3,000,000 a decade ago. The exports of trade with Central America included, however, the commerce with Panama, which in 1927 was a part of Colombia, and therefore included in the figures of trade with South America.

From South America the imports in 1927 were \$18,000,000, against \$10,000,000 in 1917, and the exports thereto \$20,000,000, against \$12,000,000 a decade ago. The figures being exclusive of the trade with British and Dutch Guiana, and the territory included under the term "Latin American." From the Latin West Indies, under which term are included Cuba, Porto Rico, Hayti, Santo Domingo and the French West Indian possessions, the imports in 1927 were \$12,000,000, against \$4,000,000 in 1917, and the exports thereto \$17,000,000, against \$11,000,000 in 1917.
