

WILL OBSERVE NEW YEAR'S DAY

Rosh Ha-shanah Marked by Special Services in Jewish Synagogues.

SIGNIFICANCE OF EVENT MOST IMPORTANT SOLEMN DAY OF ENTIRE YEAR.

The observance of Rosh Ha-shanah, the Jewish new year, will begin this evening at 8 o'clock, when, in the temple E'nal Israel, services appropriate to the occasion will be held.

The observance of Rosh Ha-shanah, the Jewish new year, is an annual event of first importance. The observance of the first of Tishri (the seventh month) as Rosh Ha-shanah, is universal.

On Rosh Ha-shanah the means of sustenance of every person are apportioned for the year. In different countries the feast on Rosh Ha-shanah varies, but the custom of eating cakes dipped in honey, fruits and sometimes a calf's head is observed.

The shofar, or ram's horn, the instrument blown on New Year's day, must be free from defect of any kind, such as a hole, which, affecting the sound, renders it unfit for use.

At the conclusion of the services there are the expressions of greeting. The form generally used is "Leshono tivo tikshon" ("May you be inscribed for a good year").

Late in the nineteenth century it became the custom to send to acquaintances New Year's greeting cards of various designs, colors and inscriptions.

BEATS COAL COMBINE. Salt Lake Man's Invention Demonstrates That Smoke Consuming Is Practical and Is Also a Great Fuel Saver.

That the smokestack of the Royal laundry does not pour forth great volumes of smoke and soot is only an account of a neat invention of Robert Stocker of this city, who has formed a company known as the Stocker Smoke & Fuel Saving Device company.

After many years as a fireman, Mr. Stocker perfected this device, which can be put under any boiler, at very small expense compared to the saving it makes in fuel, not taking into consideration the fact of its cleanliness.

The device is so arranged that heated air comes in contact with the smoke and gases in a chamber, thereby causing the most severe storm of fire ignitable. This chamber is just back of the furnace proper, yet under the boiler, and it is readily seen this is where the fuel is saved. Only the fumes escape from the stack, they being almost invisible.

When The Herald representative visited the laundry yesterday he was cordially invited to inspect the workings of the new device, and was informed by one of the proprietors that they were saving fully 25 per cent of coal, and that after installing the device they had been to no expense whatever. He further said: "We are so well pleased with the results we have obtained that we are only too glad to show anyone the device and explain its workings.
