FLOUR IS AGAIN GOING SKYWARD Advance Is Noted in All Grades With High Patent at Two Dollars and Sixty Cents.

There has been a noteworthy increase in the price of flour of all grades during the last few days. The figures quoted now are on an average of ten cents higher all around than they have ruled.

A decrease in the price of lemons is noted, both in retail stalls and in wholesale houses. Thirty-five cents a dozen instead of forty cents, is the quotation made by the retailers, and the wholesalers have cut the price from \$2.00 per case to \$1.50 per case.

The butter market yesterday was 20 cents. Utah tomatoes have gone down 10 cents the bushel, the price now being 30 cents. Spring chickens are quoted at 25 cents the pound. There is no change in the fish market.
