SAMPLES FROM SOUTH COLUMBUS

Rock From New Strike Brought Down by Mine Superintendent Yesterday.

ASSAYS SHOW FINE VALUES

WIDTH OF SHOOT IS STILL UNDETERMINED.

Confirmation of the reported big strike in the South Columbus Consolidated was obtained from Superintendent A. O. Jacobson upon his appearance at the company's main offices yesterday with samples of the ore.

"It is impossible to say yet how wide the new ore shoot is going to prove to be," said Mr. Jacobson. "A round of holes were put in and fired yesterday and there was nothing but ore ahead when the smoke cleared away and it was possible to see what the blasts had disclosed. It is very evident that a large and important body of ore has been cut and we shall determine its extent on the tunnel level just as rapidly as possible. The high-grade ore is up to 25 per cent copper, and contains silver, with \$2 in gold and a fine excess of iron over silica. The second grade stuff is evidently going to run about 7 per cent copper, with 20 ounces silver and \$1 in gold. This second class ore carries too much silica to make it a good marketable product as it looks, but it will make an ideal concentrating product, so we are not worrying over its presence in large volume in the mine. It is the best strike we have yet made in the property and it promises to develop into something altogether out of the ordinary."

At the Columbus Consolidated everything is moving as usual, Mr. Jacobson says, and while there has been a strong touch of winter already at camp, he looks for good weather right up to the first of the year and maybe longer.

COPPER STOCKS IN BOSTON AND NEW YORK

Following is the daily market comment of Paine, Webber & Co., Boston, together with the range of prices of copper stocks and other Boston listings which are of interest, as well as a similar report on New York curb transactions, a feature that has been added recently by James A. Boston, Nov. 2.—The buying of North Butte was one of the features today, over 4,000 shares being taken at 42 by good houses. Copper Range and Shannon are both noticeable for their scarcity and strength. The bank statement was published after the close and looks bad on the face, but sober consideration will show that the large increase in loans is on account of the clearing house certificates, and that these will be materially reduced in the near future. There is no evidence in stocks at this level and recommend all people with money to invest to take on the better class of stocks. Expect dullness for some time, but a general improvement in prices. Week Closes With the Market Showing Good Strength.

All things considered the week closes on the local mining exchange with the market in good condition. Colorado, Lower Mammoth, May Day and a number of other stocks behaved particularly well, and even Uncle Sam, with the selling of big blocks of stock, closed within a point of the opening price. There is steady buying of all the good stocks around the prevailing low prices and that means that strong hands are securing them, for the weak scalping element is now practically out of the game.

BIG DELEGATION DESIRED AT MINING CONGRESS

The American Mining congress will begin its annual meeting at Joplin, Mo., one week from tomorrow and the Utah delegation, in order to be there at the opening, will need to leave Salt Lake next Friday night.

From all the advance information that has been received concerning the gathering, it will be the most important one in the history of the organization. Year by year the congress is broadening its field of usefulness in the mining world and at the coming gathering measures will be taken up that are calculated to favor a particular bearing on the future growth and success of the mining and allied industries. Mentioning the matter yesterday John Smith, who is a prominent official and an ardent worker in the organization, stated that he hoped to see a large delegation go from Utah, this year, and he believed that much good could be accomplished and the state given added prestige in the mining world by the appearance at and active participation in the deliberations of the gathering. The small cost of making the pilgrimage by the delegates named for Utah would, Mr. Denver says, be fully compensated for not only in the weight the delegation could wield, but in the good time they would enjoy, as well.

GOLDFIELD ORE OUTPUT.

Value of Last Week's Production Estimated at \$325,000.

(Special to The Herald.)
Goldfield, Nev., Nov. 2.—The ore output of the Goldfield district during the seven days ending last night contained gold to the value of \$325,000. This includes a shipment to the mint of bullion from the Combination mill worth \$30,000. Neither the Mohawk Jumbo nor the Little Florence, the two heaviest shippers among the leases, sent ore to the samplers during the week. The former is closed down and the Little Florence, with a plethoric treasury, is storing its ore on the premises. The Combination mill is working on ore of a high value. The average tonnage for the week was about 80. The Kinkead mill is running on Red Top ore worth about \$25 and treated 120 tons.

There were no shipments by rail excepting to the plant of the Western Ore Purchasing company at Millers. No ore was received by the Nevada Goldfield reduction works.

The Consolidated mined 2,577 tons, and the Florence leases 136 tons. The Great Western at Lime Point marketed one car containing 22 tons.
