CHURCH SUES SHORT LINE. Passing Trains Alleged to Make Twenty-second Ward Meeting House Untenable.

Because it is alleged that the smoke from passing trains befouls the atmosphere of their house of worship, tarnishes the furniture and walls and soils the clothing of the worshippers, the Twenty-second Ward corporation of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints yesterday brought suit against the Oregon Short Line railroad for \$10,000 damages.

Because it is alleged that the noise made by trains, the puffing of engines and the blowing of whistles disturb the speakers at the various religious exercises held in the meeting house on Third North street, and make it impossible to use the building for the purpose for which it was constructed.
