

IN MEMORY OF KING OSCAR

Appropriate Address by T. Arnoldson Given at Service in Swedish Lutheran Church.

Services were held last night at the Swedish Lutheran church, in memory of the late King Oscar of Sweden. The church was decorated with the national colors of Sweden and a large congregation listened to T. Arnoldson give an address in which he paid high tribute to the deceased monarch.

"The story of the shepherd king is a wonderful one. From the duties of a humble shepherd he had risen to the throne of a kingdom which during his reign had become a world power. We have entered the temple of God tonight to do reverence to the memory of one who is mourned by millions of true humanitarians on both sides of the ocean."

Mr. Arnoldson then traced the origin of the former kings of Sweden for the last three hundred years and in every instance he said that the Swedish kings loved the people as the people loved their kings and that in every instance the king is responsible for the making of the Swedish heres.

Mr. Arnoldson then went on and told of the late king's life and all the wonderful things that he had done, and how dearly the people loved him. In conclusion he said: "Farewell we say, then, to the noble Swedish and our former monarch, May God, who has held his guiding hand over our beloved old fatherland, may independence and freedom, justice and piety continue in it, God bless Sweden."
