

MONEY NEEDED IN SHORT ORDER

Urgent Deficiency Appropriation Bill Introduced in House by Chairman Tawney.

MANY MILLIONS CARRIED COMMITTEE, HOWEVER, KEPT UNDER ESTIMATES.

Washington, Jan. 22.—Chairman Tawney of the house committee on appropriations today reported the urgency deficiency bill and gave notice that he would call it up tomorrow.

The bill carries a total appropriation of \$24,174,450, including the following items:

Treasury department, \$1,638,337; District of Columbia, \$304,184; military establishment, \$4,080,875; back pay and bounty claims, \$300,000; naval establishment, \$1,611,790; department of the interior, \$344,647; department of commerce and labor, \$553,900; United States courts, \$504,039; postal service, \$1,006,851; isthmian canal, \$12,178,900; house of representatives, \$78,752; judgments court of claims, \$187,569; audit of accounts, \$292,018.

Less Than Estimates. The total amount recommended is \$784,905 less than the total sum of estimates.

Included in the \$24,000,000 total is an appropriation of \$200,000 to carry forward through May and June, 1908, the work of eradicating bubonic plague in San Francisco. The funds now available for that purpose will be exhausted in April. On the first of July the regular appropriation (sundry civil) for the public health and marine hospital service which has charge of the plague work will become available. The deficiency appropriation of \$200,000 is merely to tide over the interim.

United States to Pay All. One paragraph of the bill provides that all expenses that may be incurred in the approaching trial of the Hyde, Dimond, Benson and Schneider Pacific coast land fraud cases shall be paid wholly by the United States. This will amount to approximately \$50,000, and in a letter to the appropriations committee, some weeks ago, Attorney General Bonaparte recommended that the district be made to pay half of this sum, although the matter had no connection with the district in any particular.

WORMY FRUIT QUESTION.

Boise, Idaho, Jan. 22.—The Idaho State Horticultural society, at its annual meeting at Payette, has the subject of the sale of wormy or infected fruit before it in an interesting manner. The state law provides that no such fruit shall be sold except for immediate manufacture into by-products. This law, enacted a year ago, is bitterly opposed by a class of fruit growers, but is sustained by most of the leaders in the business. The objectors claim they should enjoy perfect liberty in disposing of their products of whatever quality. Judge Fremont Wood, president of the association and the foremost apple grower of the state, raised the issue in his annual address, anticipating the objectors and inviting them to fight the matter out. He took very strong grounds in support of the law.

NATIONAL CAPITAL NOTES

Howell of Utah Introduces a Bill Providing for Surveys of Green and Grand Rivers.

(Special to The Herald.) Washington, D. C., Jan. 22.—Senator Clark's bill providing for holding annual terms of the United States court at Lander, Wyoming, passed the senate today.

Robert W. Breckens of Cheyenne was today re-appointed district attorney of Hawaii for the term of six years. He was endorsed for the place by Senators Clark and Warren and Representative Mondell.

Representative Howell has introduced a bill authorizing the secretary of the treasury to examine and survey Green river from the mouth of Grand river to Green River City and Green river from the mouth to Moab to determine the cost of desired improvements to navigation of these streams. One hundred and fifty thousand dollars is provided by the bill for cost of the surveys.

T. W. Clancey of Ogden was today appointed railway mail clerk.

The secretary of the interior has approved indemnity school land selections of Idaho for 5,445 acres in the Coeur d'Alene district and 10,040 acres in the Blackfoot district.

Senator Heyburn today obtained a favorable report from the public lands committee on his bill for granting leaves of absence to entrymen upon

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lands under government irrigation works. The deficiency appropriation bill reported in the house today contains an item of \$10,000 for continuing surveys and allotments of lands on the Walker river, Nevada, and Uintah and White River reservations, Utah, which have been suspended on account of lack of funds. It also contains an item of \$137,000 to provide for expenses of hearing of the general land office to determine alleged fraudulent entries of public lands.
