

GERMAN FIRST IN GRAND PRIX

Makes Good Time in Blue Ribbon Auto Event—Two Men Are Killed.

Dieppe, July 7.—The Grand Prix, the blue ribbon of the automobile world, was won today by a German, Lautenschlager, driving a Mercedes car. His time was 6 hours, 5 minutes, 45 seconds. Hemery, in a Benz, was second, and Hanriot, also in a Benz, was third.

The German victory was not popular, but still the crowd cheered Lautenschlager with a right good will. There were numerous accidents, and two men were killed outright.

A Weigel car, driven by Harrison, an Englishman, turned somersault at a dangerous point in the road and Harrison was badly crushed. The surgeons say his injuries are not mortal.

When Strauch turned up after the race he explained that he had had the trouble at every round and that finally his cylinder was washed out.

Million People Present. Almost a million people saw German drivers capture the automobile honors of 1908. They got the first three places in the Grand Prix race, while another German cut down the Dieppe track record by one hour and forty-five minutes.

The race today was the most exciting since the Grand Prix was inaugurated. A terrific pace was set at the start and three Frenchmen, Sziez, They and Bablot and Wagner, an Italian, and Salzer, a German, beat the lap record, made last year, in the first round.

In the second round Lautenschlager, in the Mercedes, took the lead, but the strain began to tell on the leaders. Tire trouble then developed and a strong wind, at times reaching the proportions of half a gale that blew straight in the faces of the drivers as they came down the sea leg of the triangular course, forced a reduction of the pace and put an end to the hopes entertained earlier in the day that the record of last year would be broken.

Lautenschlager, in the Mercedes, drove steadily and took the fourth round when Nazarro dropped back owing to a jammed clutch, and he maintained his position to the finish.
