RECORD RUN IN THREE COUNTIES

Chalmers-Detroit Covers Two Hundred Miles on Herald's Election Returns.

A dash through three counties, covering the outlying voting districts, was the feat accomplished yesterday by the Herald in a Chalmers-Detroit car. This was done to give the friends of the Herald prompt returns on the election and also show what can be accomplished by the Chalmers-Detroit car under forced conditions. The run included a little over 200 miles, and was made without stopping the motor of the car, without lifting the hood, refilling the radiator, oiling or in any way changing or altering any part of the car, including the tires. Half a hundred voting districts were visited in the three counties, and the entire trip was made in a little under eleven hours, including all stops. Leaving the Herald office at 6:20 a. m. with Frank Bortell, manager of the Bortell Automobile company of this city at the wheel, and Lee Moore as a change driver, and a reporter for The Herald, the car started down Main street for Springville in the southern part of Utah county. The chilly, frosty early morning air made traveling at a thirty-mile-an-hour clip, anything but pleasant, and after several stops, including a visit to the county Democratic headquarters at Provo, the party arrived at Springville at 9:30 a. m. A stop of five minutes and the return trip to Salt Lake, via Sandy and Bingham Junction, brought the party back to Salt Lake at 12:30, with a total of 104.6 miles to the machine's credit. One return to Salt Lake brought up the total mileage to 200, and the time of arrival was 5:20 p. m. The trip is the only one ever made under the same conditions in this state in the same length of time. When the Chalmers-Detroit reached The Herald office at the end of the trip, the thousands who had gathered to hear the election returns greeted the machine at the end of its record run.
