

MURRAY'S NAME MISUSED BY FORGER Spurious Paper Aggregating a Million Dollars Turns up at San Francisco.

The name of James A. Murray, a director in the National Bank of the Republic of Salt Lake and an owner of considerable property here, has been used by a forger on paper at San Francisco to the extent of at least a million dollars.

President William G. Henshaw acknowledged the presence of the four \$100,000 notes in the vault of the Union Savings bank of Oakland.

Henshaw said: "Mr. Murray called upon me and disclaimed all knowledge of the notes, as I believed that he would, and that, of course, has made it a closed incident."

"Signor appeared with a power of attorney from Mr. Murray. He discredited a letter purporting to come from Mr. Murray, and said that it was a forgery, and that other people were trying to break up a cement deal. Shortly afterward he presented the one-day notes for \$400,000.

"It was when it was learned that Mr. Murray was in Monterey that Signor came to me and suggested that we go to Monterey and see Murray. I said, 'All right, we will go this afternoon.' That was on Wednesday. We got as far as San Jose when Signor broke down and confessed to me that the notes he had given us—myself and brother—purporting to come from Murray, were forgeries. He said that he thought to pull off a deal and get a commission.

VISITOR FROM THE SKIES Meteor Observed by Hundreds of People at St. Joseph, Mo., and Many in Kansas.

St. Joseph, Mo., Dec. 20.—The strangest meteor ever seen in this part of the country fell from the skies between 5 and 6 o'clock this afternoon and was seen by several hundred persons here.

The meteor seemed to drop somewhere west of here, probably in Kansas. It had the appearance of a ball of fire about the size of a street lamp. The tail, or stream of sparks, was several feet in length. The meteor was visible about thirty seconds. A peculiar white streak, regarded as a phenomena, which the meteor seemed to leave behind it, was visible for fifteen minutes. It seemed to waver in its course, as if blown by the wind, and gradually faded from sight.

Kansas City, Dec. 20.—Wichita and Salina, Kan., report having seen the meteor about 6 o'clock today. At Wichita the attention of persons outdoors was attracted to a sudden flash of light. Persons at Salina reported having seen two meteors at about the same hour.
