Rev. C. C. McIntire Delivers Scathing Address Against Atheism and Irreverence, and Points to One Divorce for Every Seven Marriages in Salt Lake City

Lesson of Service Drawn in Eloquent Style by P. A. Simpkin

"The war-drum throbs no longer, and the battle flags are furled, in the parliament of man, the federation of the world." amid all the horror with which men will review the days of war's brutality and men's pride and bigotry, with solemn judgment they will look on the great conflict of the Civil War whose heroism and sacrifice we remember today.

"There is a ground for large hope in all the memories of sacrifice. In the clear seeing of our day, in the quick sense of shame for selfishness and pride, there are few anniversaries finding observance that do not call forth at least some element of the worthy for the filing of the spirit.

"No land under the broad skies of God has a more beautiful custom than this. With the break of the dawn almost yonder in the fog-hung waves of the Atlantic, the vessels of America dropped on the seas that hold so much of the worth of our homes in the quiet sleep of the night, and peace gone down to rest in the deep, blossoms of the sunlight, fairer than those which grow in the unperfected groves of the sea floor.
